

POLICE REGULATION (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1976

EXPLANATORY NOTE

THE object of this Bill is to insert in the Police Regulation Act, 1899, a new section, 5A, so as to require the Commissioner of Police to prepare or cause to be prepared not later than 31st July in each year a priority list containing the names of sergeants who are to be recommended for promotion to fill vacancies expected to occur in the rank of inspector during the period of 12 months commencing on 1st October following the preparation of the list.
