
POLICE REGULATION (APPEALS) AMENDMENT BILL, 1978

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

This Bill is cognate with the Police Regulation (Allegations of Misconduct) Bill, 1978.

The object of this Bill is to amend the Police Regulation (Appeals) Act, 1923, to limit appeals to the Crown Employees Appeal Board from a decision of the Commissioner of Police to punish a member of the Police Force to appeals against the severity of the punishment imposed.

Police Regulation (Appeals) Amendment.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

5 1. This Act may be cited as the "Police Regulation (Appeals) Short title. Amendment Act, 1978".

Police Regulation (Appeals) Amendment.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :----

Short title.

This Act may be cited as the "Police Regulation (Appeals) 1. Amendment Act, 1978".

Commencement.

(1) This section and section 1 shall commence on the date 2. of assent to this Act.

(2) Except as provided by subsection (1), this Act shall commence upon the day appointed and notified under section 2 (2) of the Police Regulation (Allegations of Misconduct) Act, 1978.

- (b) the Board, the Commissioner and the appellant are bound by the findings of that Tribunal upon the hearing and determination of the charge or upon appeal to the Review Division of that Tribunal.
