

**B**<sup>E</sup> it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Prices Regulation (Bread) Amendment Act, 1976".

Interpretation. 2. For the purposes of sections 3 and 6, "bread" has the meaning ascribed thereto in Regulation 11 (12) of the Pure Food Regulations, 1937.

Bread declared goods. 3. Bread is declared goods as defined in section 3 (1) of the Prices Regulation Act, 1948.

Schedules.

4. Schedules 1, 2, 3 and 4 have effect.

Effect of Schedules.

Powers, etc., of the Minister. 6. Notwithstanding the Prices Regulation Act, 1948, the powers, authorities, duties and functions conferred or imposed on the Prices Commissioner appointed under that Act shall, in relation to bread, be exercised or performed exclusively by the Minister who, in the exercise or performance of those powers, authorities, duties or functions, shall be deemed to be the Prices Commissioner so appointed.

An order referred to in section 5 and any order made Revocation by the Minister pursuant to the powers conferred on him by <sup>of orders.</sup> section 6 may be revoked by an order made under the Prices Regulation Act, 1948, being an order after the day appointed and notified under section 2 (2) of the Prices Regulation (Amendment) Act, 1976.

 $B^{E}$  it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Prices Regulation (Bread) Amendment Act, 1976".

Interpretation. 2. For the purposes of sections 3 and 6, "bread" has the meaning ascribed thereto in Regulation 11 (12) of the Pure Food Regulations, 1937.

Bread declared goods. 3. Bread is declared goods as defined in section 3 (1) of the Prices Regulation Act, 1948.

Schedules.

Schedules 1, 2, 3 and 4 have effect.

Effect of Schedules. 5. For the purposes of this Act, Schedules 1, 2, 3 and 4 shall be deemed to be orders made under section 20 of the Prices Regulation Act, 1948.

Powers, etc., of the Minister. 6. Notwithstanding the Prices Regulation Act, 1948, the powers, authorities, duties and functions conferred or imposed on the Prices Commissioner appointed under that Act shall, in relation to bread, be exercised or performed exclusively by the Minister who, in the exercise or performance of those powers, authorities, duties or functions, shall be deemed to be the Prices Commissioner so appointed.

#### Prices Regulation (Bread) Amendment.

7. An order referred to in section 5 and any order made Revocation by the Minister pursuant to the powers conferred on him by <sup>of orders.</sup> section 6 may be revoked by an order made under the Prices Regulation Act, 1948, being an order after the day appointed and notified under section 2 (2) of the Prices Regulation (Amendment) Act, 1976.

8. This Act is repealed on the day on which none of the Duration orders referred to in section 5 or made by the Minister pursuant to the powers conferred on him by section 6 remains in force.

Cowan: thence a straight line to the junction of Old Northern Road and Cattai Ridge Road; thence a straight line to the junction of Pitt Town Road and Blue Gum Road; thence via Blue Gum Road to Annangrove Road; thence via Annangrove and Nelson Roads to Windsor Road; thence via Windsor Road to the boundary of Blacktown and Windsor Municipalities; thence in a southwesterly direction via the boundary of the Blacktown Municipality to South Creek; thence in a southerly direction via South Creek to the southern boundary of the Commonwealth property; thence via the southern boundary of the Commonwealth property to Richmond Road; thence via Richmond Road to Andrews Road and along Andrews Road to Castlereagh Road; thence via Castlereagh Road to Mill Lane; thence via Mill Lane to the Nepean River; thence in a southerly direction along the eastern bank of the Nepean River to Mulgoa Creek; thence along Mulgoa Creek to the Mulgoa Road; thence via the Mulgoa Road to Enfield Street; thence via Enfield Street to the boundary of the proposed Western Expressway; thence via the proposed Western Expressway to Wallgrove Road; thence via Wallgrove Road to Elizabeth Drive; thence via Elizabeth Drive to the Old Cowpasture Road; thence via the Old Cowpasture Road to the Hume Highway; thence via the Hume Highway to Campbelltown Road; thence via Campbelltown Road to Wollongong Road; thence in a southerly direction along Wollongong Road

to the junction of Fitzgibbon Lane; thence a straight line to the junction of the boundaries of the Municipality of Campbelltown, the City of Wollongong and the Sutherland Shire; thence in an easterly direction via the southern boundary of the Sutherland Shire to the coast; thence generally in a northerly direction along the coast of New South Wales to the point of commencement; and includes such premises as are erected on any land having a frontage to either side of any of the sections of the roads, lanes, streets, expressways, drives or highways named above;

- "Wollongong Area" means the area within the City of Wollongong;
- "wrapped", in relation to the sale of any bread, means that that bread is, prior to delivery to the place at which that bread is sold by retail, fully enclosed and sealed in waxed or greaseproof paper, cellulose film, polythene or other similar wrapping, and that that bread was so enclosed and sealed when sold.

#### Maximum Prices—Sales by Retail.

2. (1) Subject to subclauses (2) and (3), it is hereby declared that the maximum price at which bread may be sold by retail in New South Wales outside the Sydney Metropolitan Area, Newcastle Area, Broken Hill Area, Menindee Area and Wollongong Area, whether that bread is delivered to the purchaser's premises or not, is the price specified in Table 1 to this Schedule according to the description and weight of each loaf of that bread and to the area within which the sale takes place.

(2) It is hereby declared that where 24 or more loaves of bread are sold by retail to the same purchaser in any one week and delivered to his premises, the maximum price for the sale of that bread shall be the maximum price determined in respect of that bread under subclause (1) reduced by 1 cent per loaf.

(3) It is hereby declared that in the case of a booked sale of bread the maximum price for the sale of that bread shall be the maximum price determined in respect of that bread under subclause (1) increased by 1 cent per loaf.

#### Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

3. Notwithstanding this Schedule, it is hereby declared that the maximum price at which any bread specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold—

- (a) by any person, shall be such price as is fixed by the Minister by notice in writing to that person; or
- (b) by any body or association of persons or any member of any such body or association, shall be such price as is fixed by the Minister by notice in writing to that body or association.

#### Prescribed Date.

4. For the purposes of section 30 (1) (b) of the Prices Regulation Act, 1948, the prescribed date is the date of assent to this Act.
