

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
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

(2) Clause (6)—

After clause (5), insert:—

(6) Without limiting clause (1A), the Governor may make regulations for the purpose of that clause prescribing standards or requirements for accommodation, including particular standards or requirements with respect to any matter referred to in any provision of this Part of this Schedule that does not, in the opinion of the Governor, make sufficiently particular provision with respect to that matter.
