
UNIVERSITY OF NEW ENGLAND (CONSTITUTION) AMENDMENT BILL, 1978

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

THE object of this Bill is to provide for the election of a member of the Legislative Council to the Council of the University of New England after each concurrent periodic Council election and Assembly general election instead of after the commencement of the term of service of members elected at a triennial Council election as required by section 17F (5) of the Constitution Act, 1902, prior to the reconstitution of the Legislative Council under the Constitution and Parliamentary Electorates and Elections (Amendment) Act, 1978.

A BILL FOR

An Act to amend the University of New England Act, 1953, with respect to the election of a member of the Legislative Council as a member of the Council of the University of New England.

[MR F. J. WALKER on behalf of MR WRAN-31 August, 1978.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- 5 1. This Act may be cited as the "University of New England Short title. (Constitution) Amendment Act, 1978".
 - 2. (1) This section and section 1 shall commence on the date Commence-of assent to this Act.
- (2) Except as provided in subsection (1), this Act shall 10 commence on the first appointed day.
 - (3) In subsection (2), "first appointed day" has the meaning ascribed thereto by section 16 of the Constitution Act, 1902.
 - 3. The University of New England Act, 1953, is amended—

Sec. 10. (Constitution of Council.)

- (a) a member of the Legislative Council elected by that Council as soon as practicable after each periodic Council election within the meaning of section 3 of the Constitution Act, 1902; and
- (b) (i) by omitting section 12 (d) and by inserting instead Sec. 12. the following paragraph:—

 (Vacation of office.)
 - (d) in the case of a parliamentary member elected by the Legislative Council—
 - (i) ceases to be a member of that Council otherwise than by reason of section 22B (1) (c) of the Constitution Act, 1902; or


- (ii) ceases to be a member of that Council by reason of section 22B (1) (c) of that Act and does not become a candidate at the next periodic Council election within the meaning of section 3 of that Act or, as the case may be, becomes a candidate but is not elected; or
- (ii) by omitting section 12 (e) (ii) and by inserting instead the following subparagraph:—
 - (ii) ceases to be a member of that Assembly by reason of its dissolution or its expiration by effluxion of time and does not become a candidate at the next general election of members of that Assembly or, as the case may be, becomes a candidate but is not elected.
- 4. Notwithstanding section 3, a member of the Council of the Saving. University of New England who was elected by the Legislative 20 Council and who is holding that office immediately before the commencement of that section does not cease to hold that office until—
 - (a) the Legislative Council elects one of its members to replace him; or
- 25 (b) he ceases to hold that office pursuant to the University of New England Act, 1953, as in force immediately before that commencement,



Act No. 89, 1978.

An Act to amend the University of New England Act, 1953, with respect to the election of a member of the Legislative Council as a member of the Council of the University of New England. [Assented to, 11th September, 1978.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "University of New England (Constitution) Amendment Act, 1978".

Commencement.

- 2. (1) This section and section 1 shall commence on the date of assent to this Act.
- (2) Except as provided in subsection (1), this Act shall commence on the first appointed day.
- (3) In subsection (2), "first appointed day" has the meaning ascribed thereto by section 16 of the Constitution Act, 1902.

Amendment of Act No. 34, 1953.

3. The University of New England Act, 1953, is amended—

Sec. 10. (Constitution of Council.)

- (a) by omitting section 10 (2) (a) and by inserting instead the following paragraph:—
 - (a) a member of the Legislative Council elected by that Council as soon as practicable after each periodic Council election within the meaning of section 3 of the Constitution Act, 1902; and

Sec. 12. (Vacation of office.)

- (b) (i) by omitting section 12 (d) and by inserting instead the following paragraph:—
 - (d) in the case of a parliamentary member elected by the Legislative Council—
 - (i) ceases to be a member of that Council otherwise than by reason of section 22B (1) (c) of the Constitution Act, 1902; or

- (ii) ceases to be a member of that Council by reason of section 22B (1) (c) of that Act and does not become a candidate at the next periodic Council election within the meaning of section 3 of that Act or, as the case may be, becomes a candidate but is not elected; or
- (ii) by omitting section 12 (e) (ii) and by inserting instead the following subparagraph:—
 - (ii) ceases to be a member of that Assembly by reason of its dissolution or its expiration by effluxion of time and does not become a candidate at the next general election of members of that Assembly or, as the case may be, becomes a candidate but is not elected.
- 4. Notwithstanding section 3, a member of the Council of the Saving. University of New England who was elected by the Legislative Council and who is holding that office immediately before the commencement of that section does not cease to hold that office until—
 - (a) the Legislative Council elects one of its members to replace him; or
 - (b) he ceases to hold that office pursuant to the University of New England Act, 1953, as in force immediately before that commencement,

whichever first occurs.

In the name and on behalf of Her Majesty I assent to this Act.
