

**BROKEN HILL WATER AND SEWERAGE (PLUMBERS,
GASFITTERS AND DRAINERS) AMENDMENT BILL, 1979**

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

This Bill is cognate with the Plumbers, Gasfitters and Drainers Bill, 1979.

The objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to remove from the Broken Hill Water and Sewerage Act, 1938, the power of the Broken Hill Water Board to issue, suspend or cancel licences authorising persons to carry out certain work on the board's water supply and sewerage pipes and works and to make by-laws with respect to the issue of licences and certificates of competency; and
- (b) to prohibit the carrying out of certain work on the board's pipes and sewers except by persons who are the holders of licences or certificates of registration granted under the proposed Plumbers, Gasfitters and Drainers Act, 1979, of a class prescribed in relation to that work or who do so under the immediate supervision of the holder of a licence of a class prescribed in relation to that work.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note refers to this Bill as introduced into Parliament.)

This Bill is cognate with the Plumbers, Gasfitters and Drainers Bill, 1978.

The objects of this Bill are—

(a) to remove from the Broken Hill Water and Sewage Act, 1978, the power of the Broken Hill Water Board to issue warrants or orders to persons authorising persons to carry out certain work on the board's sewers, supply and sewage pipes and works and to make orders with respect to the laying of drains, and certificates of competency; and

(b) to provide that certain work on the board's pipes and sewers, supply and sewage pipes and works and the laying of drains, and certificates of competency, shall be carried out by persons who are registered as plumbers, gasfitters and drainers under the proposed Plumbers, Gasfitters and Drainers Bill, 1978, or a law prescribed in relation to that work, or who are members of a recognised association of the holders of a licence of the board, or a law prescribed in relation to that work.

**An Act to amend the Broken Hill Water and Sewerage Act, 1938,
consequentially upon the enactment of the Plumbers,
Gasfitters and Drainers Act, 1979.**

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

5 **1.** This Act may be cited as the “Broken Hill Water and Sewerage (Plumbers, Gasfitters and Drainers) Amendment Act, 1979”. Short title.

2. (1) Except as provided by subsection (2), this Act shall commence on the date of assent to this Act. Commence-
ment.

10 (2) Section 3 shall commence on the day appointed and notified under section 2 (3) of the Plumbers, Gasfitters and Drainers Act, 1979.

3. The Broken Hill Water and Sewerage Act, 1938, is amended— Amendment

15 (a) by omitting section 38 and by inserting instead the following section :— Sec. 38.

20 38. (1) No person shall commence or perform work of any class or description in connection with water supply, sewerage or drainage which communicates or is intended to communicate directly or indirectly with the pipes or sewers of the board unless— Prohibition

work except
by holders
of licences,
etc.

25 (a) he is the holder of a licence or certificate of registration granted under the Plumbers, Gasfitters and Drainers Act, 1979, of a class prescribed in relation to work of that class or description; or

(b) he does so under the immediate supervision of the holder of a licence of a class prescribed in relation to work of that class or description.

5 (2) Any person who acts or knowingly employs another to act in contravention of subsection (1) is guilty of an offence under this Act and is liable upon summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$2,000.
