Act No. 14, 1979.

An Act to amend the Electricity Commission Act, 1950, to enable certain servants of The Electricity Commission of New South Wales to become contributors under the New South Wales Retirement Benefits Act, 1972. [Assented to, 18th April, 1979.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Electricity Commission (Superannuation) Amendment Act, 1979".

Commencement.

- **2.** (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), this Act shall commence on the date of assent to this Act.







EXPLANATORY NOTE
