GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1979

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

The object of this Bill is to amend section 145 of the Government Railways Act, 1912 ("the Act") to increase, from \$4,000 to \$20,000, the amount of compensation recoverable against the Public Transport Commission of New South Wales in respect of damage to property by fire caused, after the commencement of the proposed Act, by the Commission or its servants in the operation of railways (clause 3).

The Bill also effects minor amendments to section 28 of the Act for the purpose of metric conversion (clause 2).

- 3. (1) The Government Railways Act, 1912, is further amended by omitting from section 145 the words "four thousand dollars" and by inserting instead the matter "\$20,000".
- (2) The amendment made by subsection (1) does not apply so as to increase the amount recoverable under section 145 of the Government Railways Act, 1912, in respect of loss of or damage or injury to property sustained before the date of assent to this Act.
