LEGAL PRACTITIONERS (LAW FOUNDATION) AMENDMENT BILL, 1979

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

This Bill is cognate with the Law Foundation Bill, 1979.

The objects of this Bill are-

- (a) to amend section 44A (2) of the Legal Practitioners Act, 1898 ("the Principal Act"), to enable allocations to be made from the Statutory Interest Account for the promotion and furtherance of legal education in New South Wales (including legal education provided at the College of Law) and the payment of costs, charges and expenses associated with the provision of any such education (including the repayment of capital and interest charges in respect of loans used for the provision of buildings and equipment used for the provision of any such education);
- (b) to provide for a minimum annual allocation of 10 per cent of the Statutory Interest Account to be paid to the Law Foundation of New South Wales, as constituted by the proposed Law Foundation Act, 1979; and
- (c) to repeal sections 44B and 44C of the Principal Act which presently provide for the constitution and operation of the existing Law Foundation.

The Bill contains other provisions of a minor or ancillary nature.
