An Act to amend the Local Government Act, 1919, consequent
on and in connection with the enactment of the Dog (Amend-
ment) Act, 1981. [Assented to, 22nd April, 1981.]

Local Government (Dog) Amendment.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Local Government (Dog) Amendment Act, 1981".

Commencement.

2. (1) Except as provided in subsections (2) and (3), this Act shall commence on the date of assent to this Act.

(2) The several provisions of Schedule 1 shall commence on such day or days as may be appointed by the Governor in respect thereof and as may be notified by proclamation published in the Gazette.

(3) Section 3 shall, in its application to a provision of Schedule 1, commence on the day on which that provision commences.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT (DOG) AMENDMENT BILL, 1981

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

This Bill is cognate with the Dog (Amendment) Bill, 1981.

The object of this Bill is to amend the Local Government Act, 1919 ("the Principal Act") so as—

- (a) to repeal a provision empowering councils to control and regulate the conditions under which dogs may be upon roads (Schedule 1 (1));
- (b) to provide that section 249A of the Principal Act, which concerns straying animals, does not apply to dogs (Schedule 1 (2));
- (c) to repeal a provision authorising the making of ordinances relating to the fouling by dogs of public places (Schedule 1 (3)); and
- (d) to provide that the provisions of the Dog Act, 1966, where they conflict with any ordinances applying to dogs in or on public reserves, parks, etc., shall prevail over those ordinances (Schedule 1 (4)).
