

MEAT INDUSTRY (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1980

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

The objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to amend retrospectively section 43 (3) of the Meat Industry Act, 1978 ("the Principal Act"), to enable classes or descriptions of containers or packages in which processed meat or processed animal food may be imported into New South Wales without inspection in New South Wales by a meat inspector to be prescribed (clause 3 (a));
 - (b) to substitute retrospectively section 43 (4) of the Principal Act to make it clear that, where a person brings or causes or permits to be brought into New South Wales any meat, or any processed meat or processed animal food (other than processed meat or processed animal food that is contained in a hermetically sealed metal or glass container or in a container or package of a prescribed class or description), the person must take the meat, processed meat or processed animal food, or cause it to be taken, together with any container or package in which it is packed, to an approved inspection place and there submit it, or cause it to be submitted, together with any such container or package, for inspection by a meat inspector (clause 3 (b)—proposed section 43 (4));
 - (c) to amend retrospectively section 43 (6) of the Principal Act to make it clear that a person may bring or cause or permit to be brought into New South Wales processed meat or processed animal food that is contained in a hermetically sealed metal or glass container or in a container or package of a prescribed class or description, being processed meat or processed animal food that was manufactured on certain premises approved by the New South Wales Meat Industry Authority (clause 3 (c)); and
 - (d) to make other provisions of a minor or transitional nature.
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MEAT INDUSTRY (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1978

GENERAL NOTE

The Bill is intended to amend the Meat Industry Act, 1978 (the Principal Act) in relation to the importation of meat into New Zealand.

The objects of the Bill are—

(a) to amend retrospectively section 45 (3) of the Meat Industry Act, 1978 (the Principal Act) so that the provisions of that section shall apply to persons or packages in which meat or processed animal food may be imported into New Zealand without inspection in New Zealand by a meat inspector to be prescribed (clause 3 (a));

(b) to substitute retrospectively section 45 (4) of the Principal Act to make it clear that where a person brings or causes to be brought into New Zealand any meat or any processed meat or processed animal food (other than processed meat or processed animal food that is contained in a hermetically sealed metal or glass container or in a container or package of a prescribed class or description), the person must take the meat, processed meat or processed animal food or cause it to be taken together with any container or package in which it is packed, to a place of inspection and there submit it, or cause it to be submitted, together with any container or package, for inspection by a meat inspector (clause 3 (b))—proposed section 45 (4);

(c) to amend retrospectively section 45 (5) of the Principal Act to make it clear that a person may bring or cause to be brought into New Zealand any processed meat or processed animal food that is contained in a hermetically sealed metal or glass container or in a container or package of a prescribed class or description, being processed meat or processed animal food that was manufactured on certain premises approved by the New Zealand Meat Industry Authority (clause 3 (c) and

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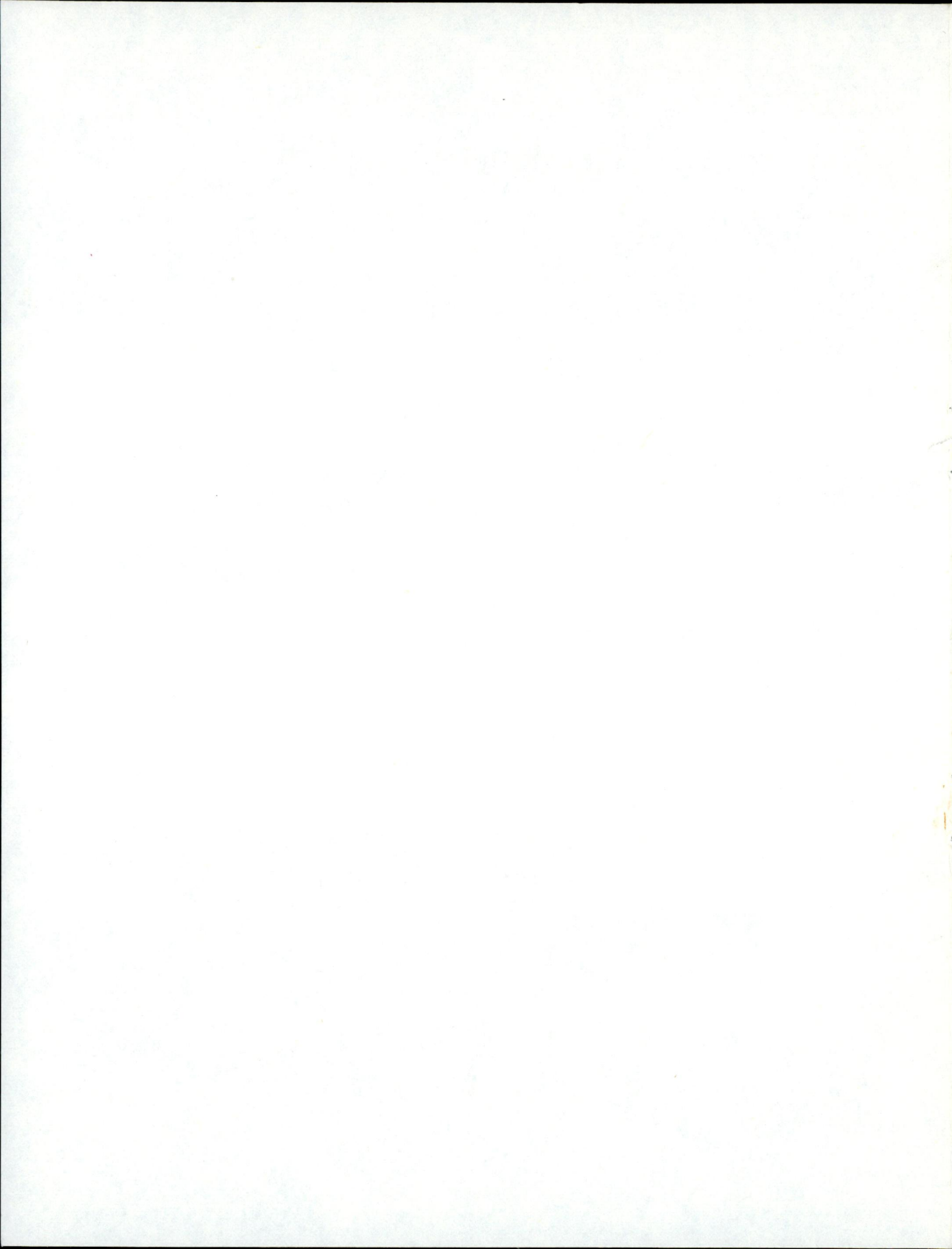

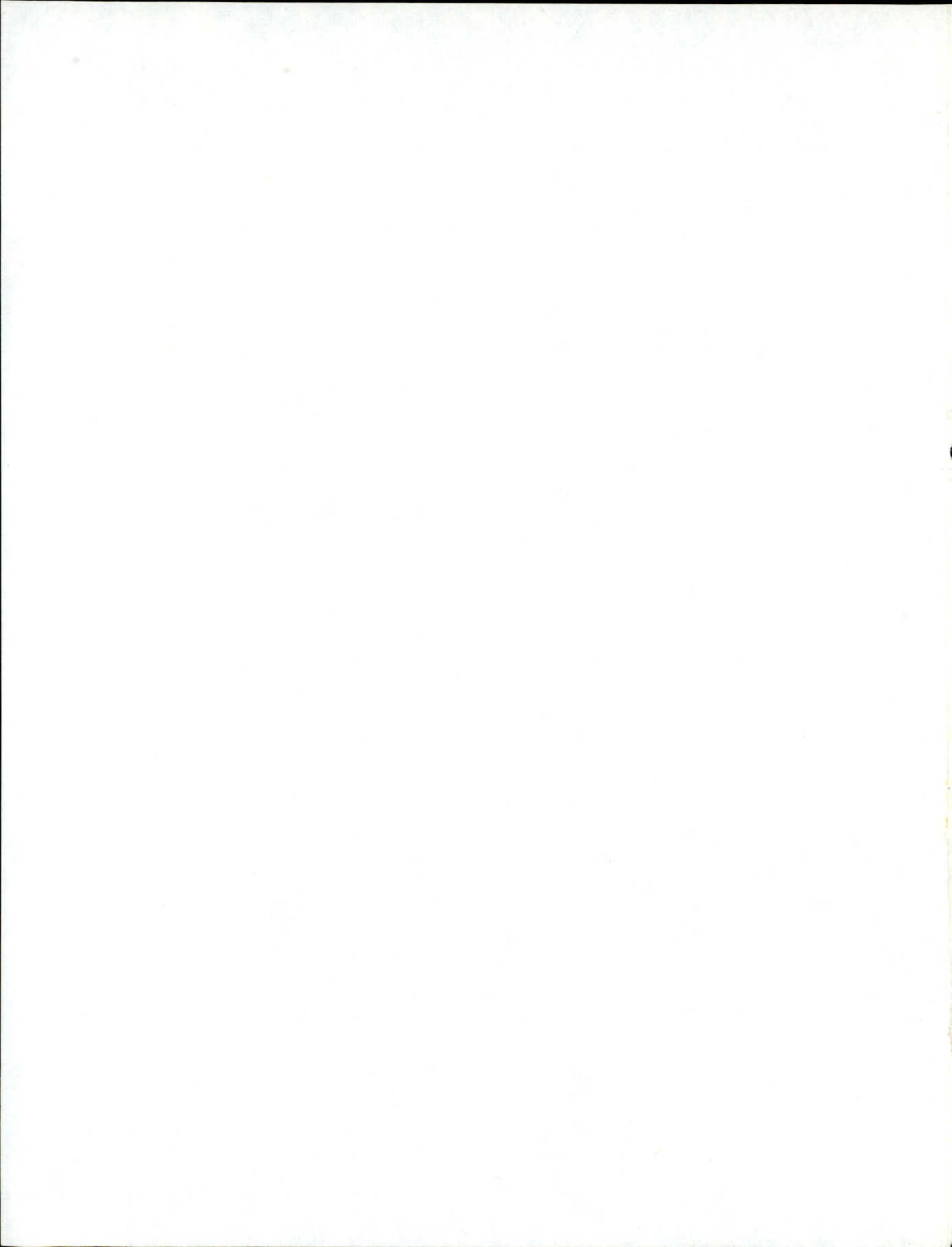
