Act No. 187, 1980.

An Act to amend certain Acts so as to enable certain officers appointed under those Acts to be retired after they have attained the age of 60 years; and for other purposes. [Assented to, 17th December, 1980.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Miscellaneous Acts (Retirement of Statutory Officers) Amendment Act, 1980".


