

**PARLIAMENTARY CONTRIBUTORY SUPERANNUATION

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

This Bill is cognate with the Constitution (Amendment) Bill, 1980.

The objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to provide that a person is not disentitled to a pension under the Parliamentary Contributory Superannuation Act, 1971, by reason of his holding or accepting an office or place of profit under the Crown if—
 - (i) the only remuneration to which he is entitled is fees for attending meetings or an allowance for reasonable expenses, or both; or
 - (ii) the office is an office of profit under the Crown other than the Crown in right of the State of New South Wales; and
- (b) to make other provisions of a minor or ancillary nature.

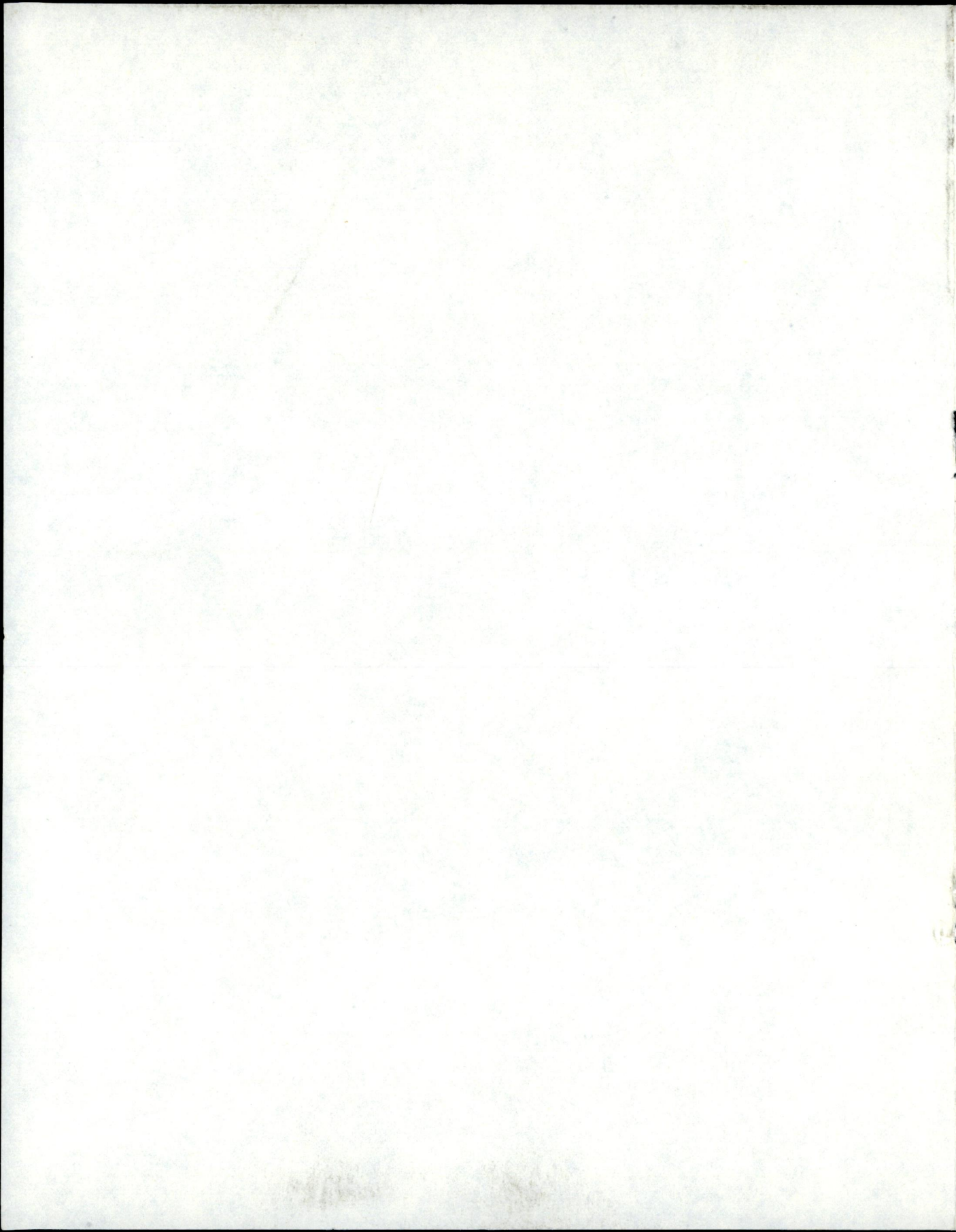
