#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

#### (This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

This Bill is cognate with the Constitution (Legislative Council Compensation) Bill, 1979.

The object of this Bill is to specify, as a consequence of the reconstitution of the Legislative Council, the period during which a member of the Legislative Council is entitled to remuneration and, in particular, to provide that remuneration is payable after the expiry of a member's term of office and until polling-day at the ensuing general election.
