

PASTURES PROTECTION (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1979

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

The objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to provide a retiring age of 70 years for directors of pastures protection boards (Schedule 1 (3) (a));
 - (b) to provide as a further qualification for the election or appointment of a person as a director of a pastures protection board that the person be under 70 years of age on the closing day for nominations of candidates for the election or, in the case of an appointment, on the day on which the appointment takes effect (Schedule 1 (8));
 - (c) to enable the Minister to appoint a director of a pastures protection board where, because of insufficient nominations, no directors have been elected or the maximum number of directors has not been elected (Schedule 1 (2) (a) and (3) (c));
 - (d) to provide that a pastures protection board may purchase or sell, in addition to an implement and a substance that may lawfully be used to suppress and destroy noxious animals and that is prescribed in respect of that board, any article or material that may be so used and is so prescribed (Schedule 1 (9));
 - (e) to enable pastures protection boards in the Western Division of the State to transfer from their public watering-places funds to their pastures protection funds an annual amount determined in accordance with the regulations under the Pastures Protection Act, 1934, rather than an amount approved by the Minister (Schedule 1 (11)); and
 - (f) to make other provisions of a minor, consequential or ancillary nature.
