

PLANT DISEASES (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1980

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

This Bill is cognate with the Stock Diseases (Further Amendment) Bill, 1980.

The object of this Bill is to amend the Plant Diseases Act, 1924, so as—

- (a) to provide that, for the purposes of that Act, a power to issue a proclamation, make an order or give a notification, a notice or an authority shall include and shall be deemed always to have included a power to revoke or amend that instrument (Schedule 1 (1) (b));
 - (b) to allow the Minister to release an owner of land from an undertaking to comply with certain requirements in respect of that land (Schedule 1 (5));
 - (c) to make it clear that an exemption from the requirement to register an orchard or nursery may be cancelled (Schedule 1 (8));
 - (d) to provide that where an inspector has given a notice under that Act, the notice may be revoked or amended by the Chief of the Division of Horticulture or an inspector authorised by him (Schedule 1 (9)); and
 - (e) to make other provisions of a consequential or ancillary nature or by way of statute law revision.

Plant Diseases (Amendment).

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

An Act to amend the Plant Diseases Act, 1924, with respect to the revocation or variation of proclamations and other instruments, and for other purposes. [Assented to, 17th December, 1980.]

Plant Diseases (Amendment).
