POULTRY PROCESSING (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1981

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

The objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to make further provision with respect to the powers of inspectors appointed for the purposes of the Poultry Processing Act, 1969 ("the Act") (Schedule 1);
- (b) to make further provision with respect to the registration of premises under the Act and in particular to require registered plants to conform to certain minimum standards (Schedule 2);
- (c) to make provision with respect to the importation of poultry meat into the State (Schedule 3);
- (d) to make further provision with respect to matters in respect of which regulations may be made under the Act (Schedule 4);
- (e) to increase certain penalties under the Act (Schedule 5);
- (f) to make further provisions of a minor, consequential or ancillary nature (Schedule 6); and
- (g) to make amendments to the Act by way of statute law revision (Schedule 7).

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POULTRY PROCESSING (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1981

A BILL FOR

An Act to amend the Poultry Processing Act, 1969, to make further provision with respect to the powers of inspectors, to make provision with respect to the importation of poultry meat into the State, to establish standards of construction and hygiene for poultry processing plants and to increase certain penalties.

[MR DAY-18 March, 1981.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Poultry Processing (Amendment) Act, 1981".

Commencement.

- 2. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), this Act shall 10 commence on the date of assent to this Act.
- (2) Section 5, in its application to Schedules 1, 2, 3, 4 and 6 (1) (a), (1) (d), (3) and (4), and Schedules 1, 2, 3, 4 and 6 (1) (a), (1) (d), (3) and (4) shall commence on such day as may be appointed by the Governor in respect thereof and as may 15 be notified by proclamation published in the Gazette.

Principal Act.

3. The Poultry Processing Act, 1969, is referred to in this Act as the Principal Act.

Duration of certain registrations.

- (i) search and inspect any such plant, premises or vehicle for the presence of, and examine, any accounts, records, books or documents relating to the carrying on of the whole or any part of the process;
- (j) take copies of, or extracts or notes from, any such accounts, records, books or documents; and
- (k) require any person found in or on any such plant, premises or vehicle to produce any such accounts, records, books or documents in his possession or under his control.
- 25 (2) A person who fails to comply with any requirement made under subsection (1) (k) shall be guilty of an offence against this Act.

Inspector's power to give directions.

- 6A. (1) An inspector may, at any plant, give such directions as he thinks proper—
 - (a) to ensure the hygienic and humane carrying on of the whole or any part of the process; and

- (b) to ensure that any weight gain of carcasses occurring in consequence of the carrying on of the whole or any part of the process does not exceed the prescribed percentage.
- (2) A direction referred to in subsection (1) that requires the installation or alteration of any machinery or equipment has no force or effect unless the direction is in writing and is given, with the approval of the Chief, Division of Animal Health, to the operator of the plant in which the machinery or equipment is or is to be installed or located or in which the equipment is or is to be used
- 15 (3) A direction referred to in subsection (1) that does not require the installation or alteration of any machinery or equipment, but compliance with which would result in the cessation of, or a substantial reduction in, the production of poultry meat at the plant in relation to which the direction is given, has no force or effect unless the direction—
 - (a) is in writing; and
 - (b) is given to—

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- (i) the operator of that plant; or
- (ii) the person apparently in charge of the production of poultry meat at that plant.
- (4) Without affecting the generality of subsection (1) or any other provision of this Act, an inspector may give such directions as are prescribed in respect of any plant.

(5) A person who fails to comply with a direction given in accordance with this section shall be guilty of an offence against this Act and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$1,000.

Condemning of poultry or poultry meat.

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- 6B. (1) An inspector may condemn, as unfit for human consumption, any poultry or poultry meat that is in or on any plant.
- (2) An inspector may direct that any poultry or poultry meat that is in or on any plant be treated, in a specified manner and within a specified time, for the purpose of making or keeping it fit for human consumption.
- (3) Without limiting the generality of subsection (1), where a direction under subsection (2) is not complied with, an inspector may condemn the poultry or poultry meat as unfit for human consumption.
- (4) Where any poultry or poultry meat is condemned under subsection (1) or (3) as unfit for human consumption, an inspector may mark (in such manner as to him seems fit) the poultry or poultry meat for the purpose of identification and, if he thinks fit, seize the poultry or poultry meat and cause it to be destroyed or otherwise disposed of.

No compensation for seizure.

6c. Any poultry or poultry meat seized under section 6 (1) (h) or 6B (4) shall become the absolute property of the Crown and no compensation shall be payable in respect of the seizure.

Inspection of books.

 - (b) search and inspect any such premises for the presence of, and examine, any such accounts, records, books or documents;
 - (c) take copies of, or extracts or notes from, any such accounts, records, books or documents; and
 - (d) require any person found in or on any such premises to produce any such accounts, records, books or documents in his possession or under his control.
 - (2) A person who fails to comply with any requirement made under subsection (1) (d) shall be guilty of an offence against this Act.

Questions by inspectors.

- 25 6E. (1) An inspector may require any operator of a plant or any person employed in or about—
 - (a) a registered plant;
 - (b) premises referred to in section 6 (1) (a) (ii);
 - (c) a vehicle referred to in section 6 (1) (a) (iii); or

- (2) A person who, when required to answer a question under subsection (1)—
 - (a) except as provided by subsection (3), refuses or fails to answer the question; or
 - (b) makes any answer which is false or misleading in a material particular,

shall be guilty of an offence against this Act.

- (3) A person is not required to answer any question asked of him under subsection (1) unless he has first been informed by the inspector asking the question that he is required to answer the question by virtue of this section.
- (4) A person may not refuse to answer a question asked of him under subsection (1) on the ground that his so doing might tend to incriminate him or make him liable to any penalty.
- (5) Any answer given by a person pursuant to a requirement made under subsection (1) after he has been informed in the manner set forth in subsection (3) shall not be admissible in evidence in any proceedings, civil or criminal, against him, other than in proceedings under subsection (2).

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- 6F. An inspector, in exercising at any premises or in relation to any vehicle any function under this Act, shall, if so requested by any person apparently in charge of—
 - (a) the premises or vehicle; or
 - (b) any act carried out in or on the premises, being an act constituting part of the process,
- produce his certificate of identification to the person.

Assistance.

6G. An inspector may be accompanied by and use such persons as he considers necessary to assist him in the exercise of his functions under this Act.

20 Obstructing inspector.

- 6н. A person who delays, obstructs, hinders or impedes—
 - (a) an inspector in the exercise of his functions under this Act; or
 - (b) a person assisting an inspector in the exercise of his functions under this Act,

shall be guilty of an offence against this Act.

 - (a) he has first served on the operator of the plant a notice specifying the standards that have been breached and stating that, unless the breach is rectified within a reasonable time specified in the notice, the Minister will suspend or cancel the registration; and
- (b) the breach so specified has not been rectified within the time so specified.

Importation of poultry meat.

- 13A. (1) A person shall not bring or cause, direct or authorise to be brought into the State any poultry meat for sale in the State unless—
 - (a) the poultry from which it came was processed—
 - (i) at a plant that was, at the time when the poultry was processed, approved by instrument in writing by the Chief, Division of Animal Health, for the purposes of this subsection; or
 - (ii) in such other circumstances as may be prescribed; and
 - (b) there appears on any package containing the poultry meat the prescribed information.





Act No. 44, 1981.

An Act to amend the Poultry Processing Act, 1969, to make further provision with respect to the powers of inspectors, to make provision with respect to the importation of poultry meat into the State, to establish standards of construction and hygiene for poultry processing plants and to increase certain penalties. [Assented to, 15th May, 1981.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Poultry Processing (Amendment) Act, 1981".

Commencement.

- **2.** (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), this Act shall commence on the date of assent to this Act.
- (2) Section 5, in its application to Schedules 1, 2, 3, 4 and 6 (1) (a), (1) (d), (3) and (4), and Schedules 1, 2, 3, 4 and 6 (1) (a), (1) (d), (3) and (4) shall commence on such day as may be appointed by the Governor in respect thereof and as may be notified by proclamation published in the Gazette.

Principal Act.

3. The Poultry Processing Act, 1969, is referred to in this Act as the Principal Act.

- (h) seize and retain any poultry or poultry meat found in or on any such plant, premises or vehicle that, in his opinion, is necessary or expedient to be seized for the purpose of carrying out any test, inspection or investigation or for enforcing the provisions of this Act;
- (i) search and inspect any such plant, premises or vehicle for the presence of, and examine, any accounts, records, books or documents relating to the carrying on of the whole or any part of the process;
- (j) take copies of, or extracts or notes from, any such accounts, records, books or documents; and
- (k) require any person found in or on any such plant, premises or vehicle to produce any such accounts, records, books or documents in his possession or under his control.
- (2) A person who fails to comply with any requirement made under subsection (1) (k) shall be guilty of an offence against this Act.

Inspector's power to give directions.

- 6A. (1) An inspector may, at any plant, give such directions as he thinks proper—
 - (a) to ensure the hygienic and humane carrying on of the whole or any part of the process; and

- (b) to ensure that any weight gain of carcasses occurring in consequence of the carrying on of the whole or any part of the process does not exceed the prescribed percentage.
- (2) A direction referred to in subsection (1) that requires the installation or alteration of any machinery or equipment has no force or effect unless the direction is in writing and is given, with the approval of the Chief, Division of Animal Health, to the operator of the plant in which the machinery or equipment is or is to be installed or located or in which the eqipment is or is to be used.
- (3) A direction referred to in subsection (1) that does not require the installation or alteration of any machinery or equipment, but compliance with which would result in the cessation of, or a substantial reduction in, the production of poultry meat at the plant in relation to which the direction is given, has no force or effect unless the direction—
 - (a) is in writing; and
 - (b) is given to—
 - (i) the operator of that plant; or
 - (ii) the person apparently in charge of the production of poultry meat at that plant.
- (4) Without affecting the generality of subsection (1) or any other provision of this Act, an inspector may give any directions as are prescribed in respect of any plant.

Condemning of poultry or poultry meat.

- (2) An inspector may direct that any poultry or poultry meat that is in or on any plant be treated, in a specified manner and within a specified time, for the purpose of making or keeping it fit for human consumption.
- (3) Without limiting the generality of subsection (1), where a direction under subsection (2) is not complied with, an inspector may condemn the poultry or poultry meat as unfit for human consumption.
- (4) Where any poultry or poultry meat is condemned under subsection (1) or (3) as unfit for human consumption, an inspector may mark (in such manner as to him seems fit) the poultry or poultry meat for the purpose of identification and, if he thinks fit, seize the poultry or poultry meat and cause it to be destroyed or otherwise disposed of.

No compensation for seizure.

6c. Any poultry or poultry meat seized under section 6 (1) (h) or 6B (4) shall become the absolute property of the Crown and no compensation shall be payable in respect of the seizure.

- (5) Any answer given by a person pursuant to a requirement made under subsection (1) after he has been informed in the manner set forth in subsection (3) shall not be admissible in evidence in any proceedings, civil or criminal, against him, other than in proceedings under subsection (2).
