**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

**(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)**

This Bill is cognate with the Intoxicated Persons Bill, 1979, and the Summary Offences (Repeal) Bill, 1979.

The object of this Bill is to exclude from the definition of "prisoner" in section 4 of the Prisons Act, 1952, a person detained under the proposed Intoxicated Persons Act, 1979, so that the provisions of the Prisons Act, 1952, will not apply to such a person.
