5 **1.** This Act may be cited as the "Privy Council Appeals Short title. Abolition Act, 1979".

2. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), this Act shall Commence-

(2) Sections 3–5 shall commence on such day as may be

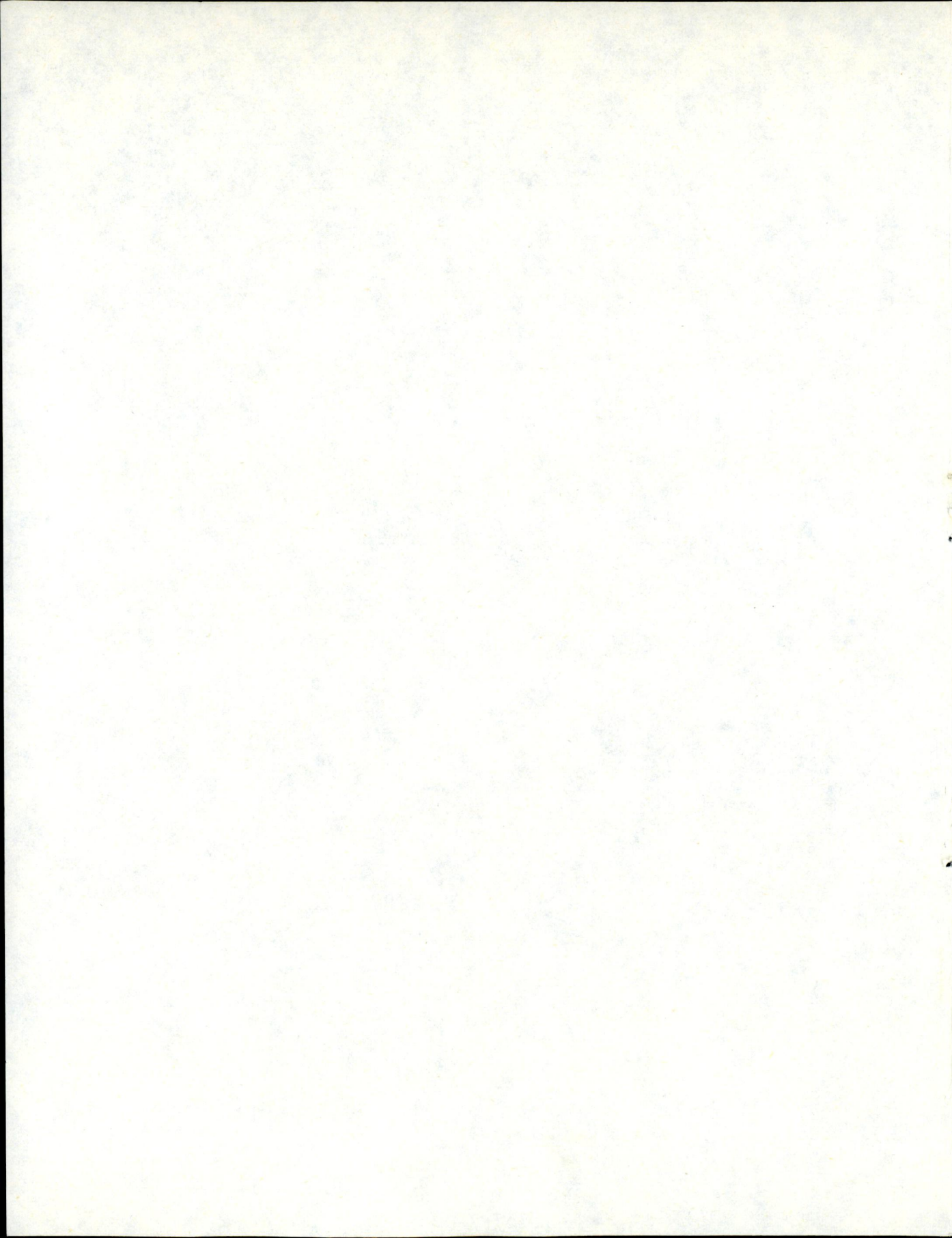
