The object of this Bill is to make provision for the revival of the Road Obstructions (Special Provisions) Act, 1979, and to make amendments to that Act.

The objects of the amendments are-

- (a) to provide that an "authorised officer", for the purposes of the Act, means a member of the police force who is of or above the rank of sergeant or who is for the time being in charge of a police station (Schedule 1 (1));
- (b) to empower the Commissioner of Police or an authorised officer to affix a notice to a motor vehicle requiring its removal from a public road if in his opinion it ought to be moved in order to prevent it obstructing or continuing to obstruct the public road (Schedule 1 (2) (a), (b), (c));
- (c) to make the offence of disobeying the notice an offence of absolute liability (Schedule 1 (2) (d)); and
- (d) to make other amendments of a minor or consequential nature.
