This Bill is cognate with the Law Reform Commission (Amendment) Bill, 1981.

The object of this Bill is to amend the Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Act, 1975, to make further provision with respect to the remuneration of commissioners of the Law Reform Commission.

**An Act to amend the Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Act, 1975,
to make further provision with respect to the remuneration of

Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration (Law Reform Commission) Amendment.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration (Law Reform Commission) Amendment Act, 1981".

Commencement.

2. (1) This section and section 1 shall commence on the date of assent to 10 this Act.

(2) Except as provided by subsection (1), this Act shall commence on the day appointed and notified under section 2 (2) of the Law Reform Commission (Amendment) Act, 1981.

Amendment of Act No. 4, 1976.

15 3. The Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Act, 1975, is amended in the manner set forth in Schedule 1.

Savings.

20 4. Notwithstanding section 3, the provisions of the Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Act, 1975, as in force immediately before the day appointed and notified under section 2 (2) of the Law Reform Commission (Amendment) Act, 1981, shall continue to apply to and in respect of the person who, immediately before that day, was the executive member of the Law Reform Commission appointed under section 6 of the Law Reform Commission Act, 1967, as so in force, and those provisions shall so continue 25 to apply until the expiration of that person's term of office or such time as that person vacates his office pursuant to the Law Reform Commission Act, 1967.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.
