An Act to amend the Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Act, 1975, to provide for the determination of the remuneration of statutory officers of the Legal Services Commission of New South Wales. [Assented to, 16th May, 1979.]

Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration (Legal Services Commission) Amendment.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

Short title. **1.** This Act may be cited as the "Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration (Legal Services Commission) Amendment Act, 1979".

Commence-
ment. **2.** (1) Except as provided by subsections (2) and (3), this Act shall commence on the date of assent to this Act.

(2) Section 3 shall commence on the day appointed and notified under section 2 (2) of the Legal Services Commission Act, 1979.

(3) Section 4 shall commence on the day appointed and notified under section 2 (3) of the Legal Services Commission Act, 1979.
