

WASTE DISPOSAL (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1980

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

The object of this Bill is to amend the Waste Disposal Act, 1970—

- (a) to specify further conditions which may be imposed by the Metropolitan Waste Disposal Authority (“the Authority”) on licences and certificates of registration granted by the Authority under Part V of that Act (Schedule 1 (1) (b)); and
 - (b) to modify procedures for settling a dispute between the Authority and another public authority concerning the exercise by the Authority of certain of its powers, by providing for the referral of disputes between the Authority and a council to the Minister (Schedule 1 (2) (c)) and by enabling either the Premier or the Minister to appoint a person to provide a report upon a dispute referred to him (Schedule 1 (2) (e)).

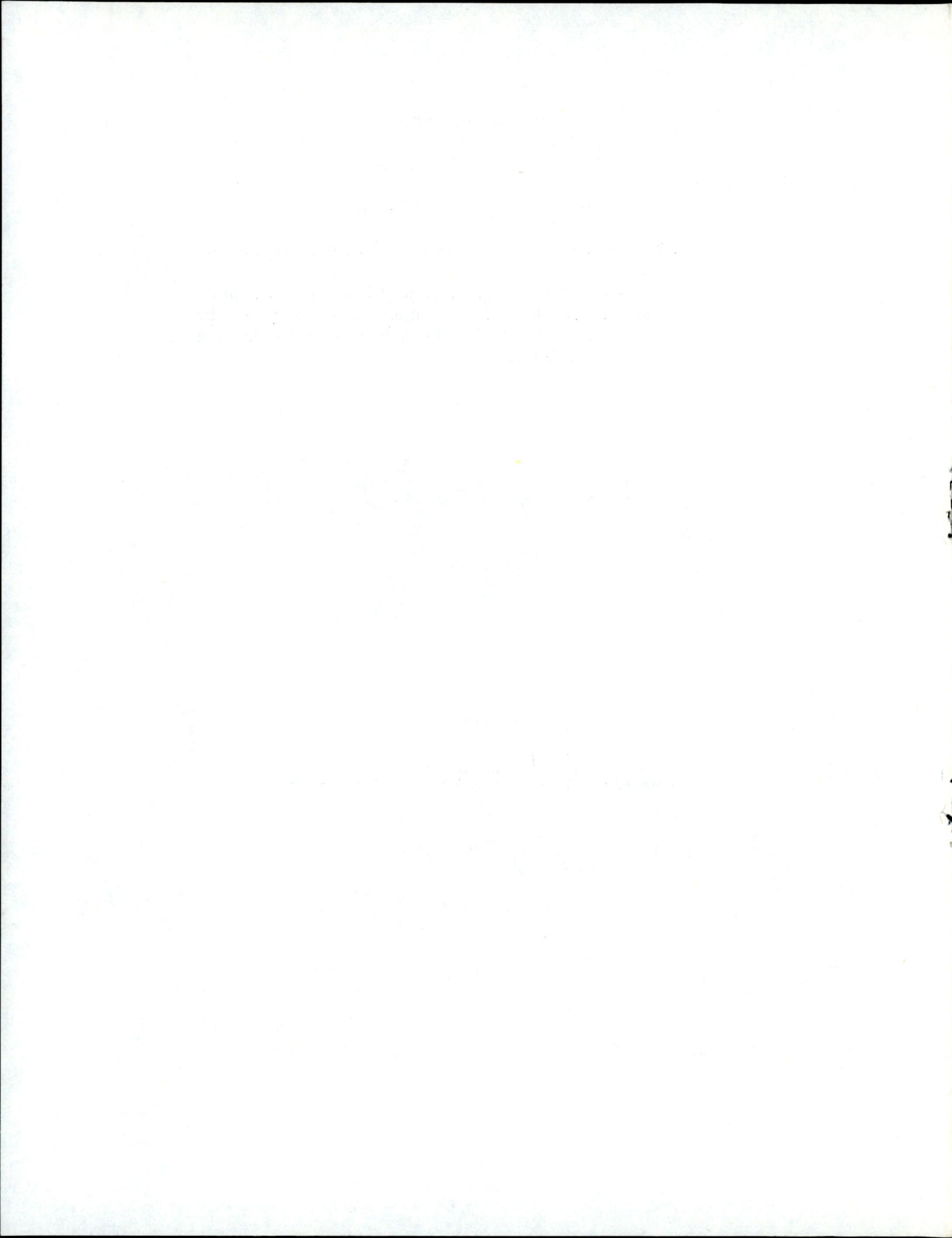

Short title. **1.** This Act may be cited as the "Waste Disposal (Amendment) Act, 1980".

Amendment of Act No. 97, 1970. **2.** The Waste Disposal Act, 1970, is amended in the manner set forth in Schedule 1.
