

WHEAT MARKETING (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1980

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

The object of this Bill is to amend section 28 of the Wheat Marketing Act, 1979, to revise references to Commonwealth Police Officers as a consequence of the enactment of the Australian Federal Police Act 1979 of the Parliament of the Commonwealth.

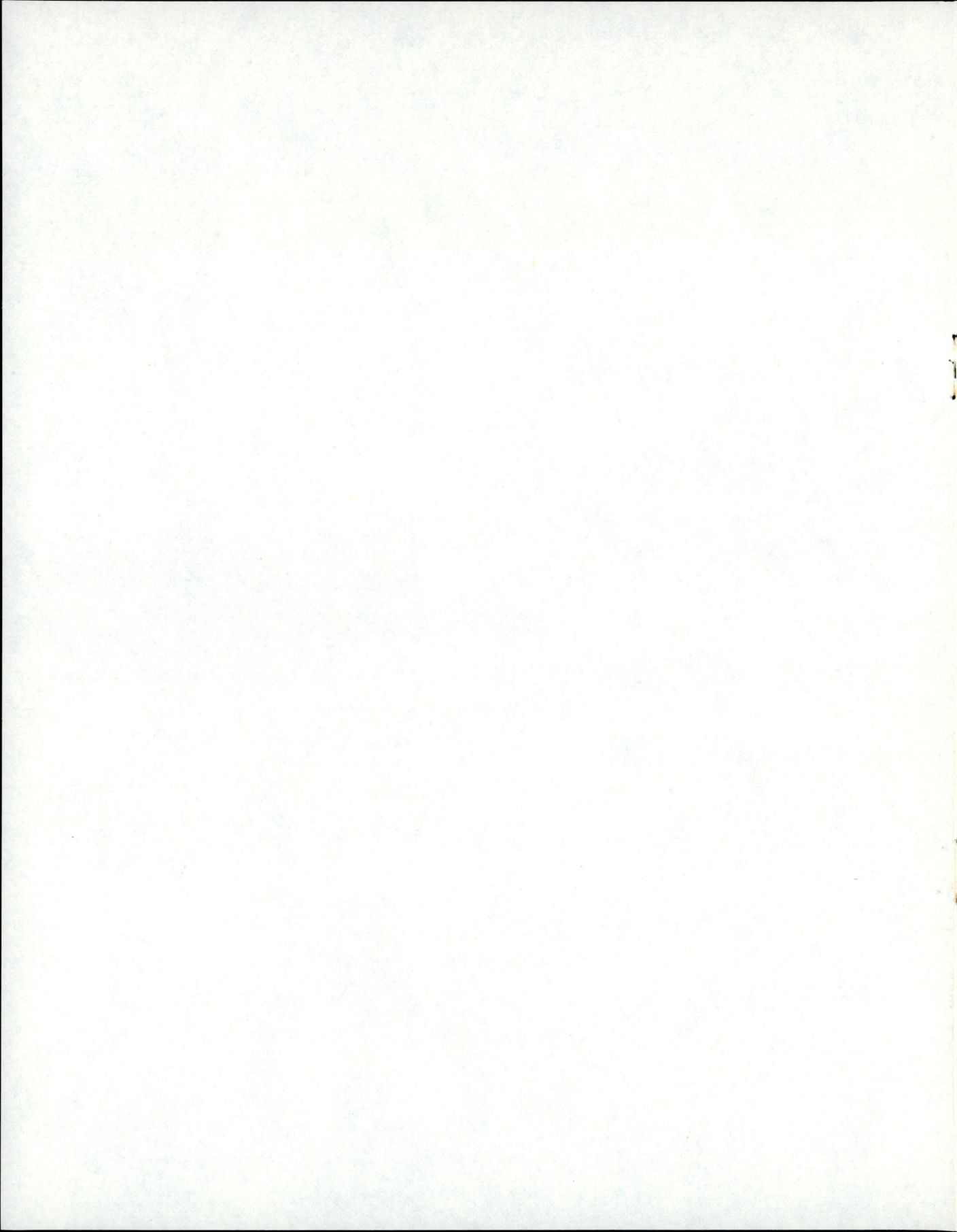

Wheat Marketing (Amendment).

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

Short title. **1.** This Act may be cited as the "Wheat Marketing (Amendment) Act, 1980".

- (d) by omitting section 28 (9) and by inserting instead the following subsection :—

(9) In this section—

"occupier", in relation to any premises, includes a person in charge of those premises;
