**BE** it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

Short title. **1.** This Act may be cited as the "Workers' Compensation (Chiropractic) Amendment Act, 1978".

Commencement. (1) This section and section 1 shall commence on the date of assent to this Act.

(2) Except as provided in subsection (1), this Act shall commence on the day appointed and notified under section 2 (3) of the Chiropractic Act, 1978.

Amendment of Act No. 15, 1926. Sec. 10. (Medical and hospital treatment, etc.) **3.** The Workers' Compensation Act, 1926, is amended by inserting in the definition of "Medical treatment" in section 10 (2) after the word "physiotherapist," the words "a registered chiropractor or osteopath,".

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

#### (This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

This Bill is cognate with the Chiropractic Bill, 1978.

The object of this Bill is to amend the Workers' Compensation Act, 1926, to provide that an employer is liable for the cost of medical treatment afforded to an injured worker by a registered chiropractor or osteopath.
