
EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

This Bill is cognate with the Conveyancing (Amendment) Bill, 1984.

The object of this Bill is to amend the Bills of Sale Act of 1898 so as to remove from section 16 a reference to bank holidays, thereby (subject to regulations) enabling the office of the Registrar-General to be open for business on bank holidays for the purpose of the lodging, filing or recording of bills of sale.

Section 5 of the Registration of Deeds Act, 1897, contains a similar reference. That Act is proposed to be repealed by the Conveyancing (Amendment) Bill, 1984, and that section is not proposed to be re-enacted.

An Act to amend the Bills of Sale Act of 1898 with respect to the days on which bills of sale may be lodged, filed or recorded in the office of the Registrar-General.

Bills of Sale (Amendment).

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Bills of Sale (Amendment) Act, 1984".

Amendment of Act No. 10, 1898.

2. The Bills of Sale Act of 1898 is amended by omitting from section 16 the words "a public or a bank holiday" and by inserting instead the words "a 10 public holiday or a prescribed day".
