EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

The New South Wales Film Corporation (Amendment) Bill, 1982, is cognate with this Bill.

The object of this Bill is to suspend the operation of the Cinematograph Films Act, 1935, for a period of 2 years.

An Act to suspend the operation of the Cinematograph Films Act, 1935,
for a period of 2 years.

Cinematograph Films (Suspension of Provisions).

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Cinematograph Films (Suspension of Provisions) Act, 1982".

Suspension of operation of Act No. 41, 1935.

2. The provisions of the Cinematograph Films Act, 1935, shall have 10 no effect during the period of 2 years commencing on the date of assent to this Act.

Saving.

3. A contract relating to the hiring of films which was entered into before the date of assent to this Act and which was affected by the provisions 15 of section 11B of the Cinematograph Films Act, 1935, continues to be so affected as if this Act had not been enacted.
