CONSTITUTION (ENROLMENT OF ACTS) AMENDMENT BILL, 1984

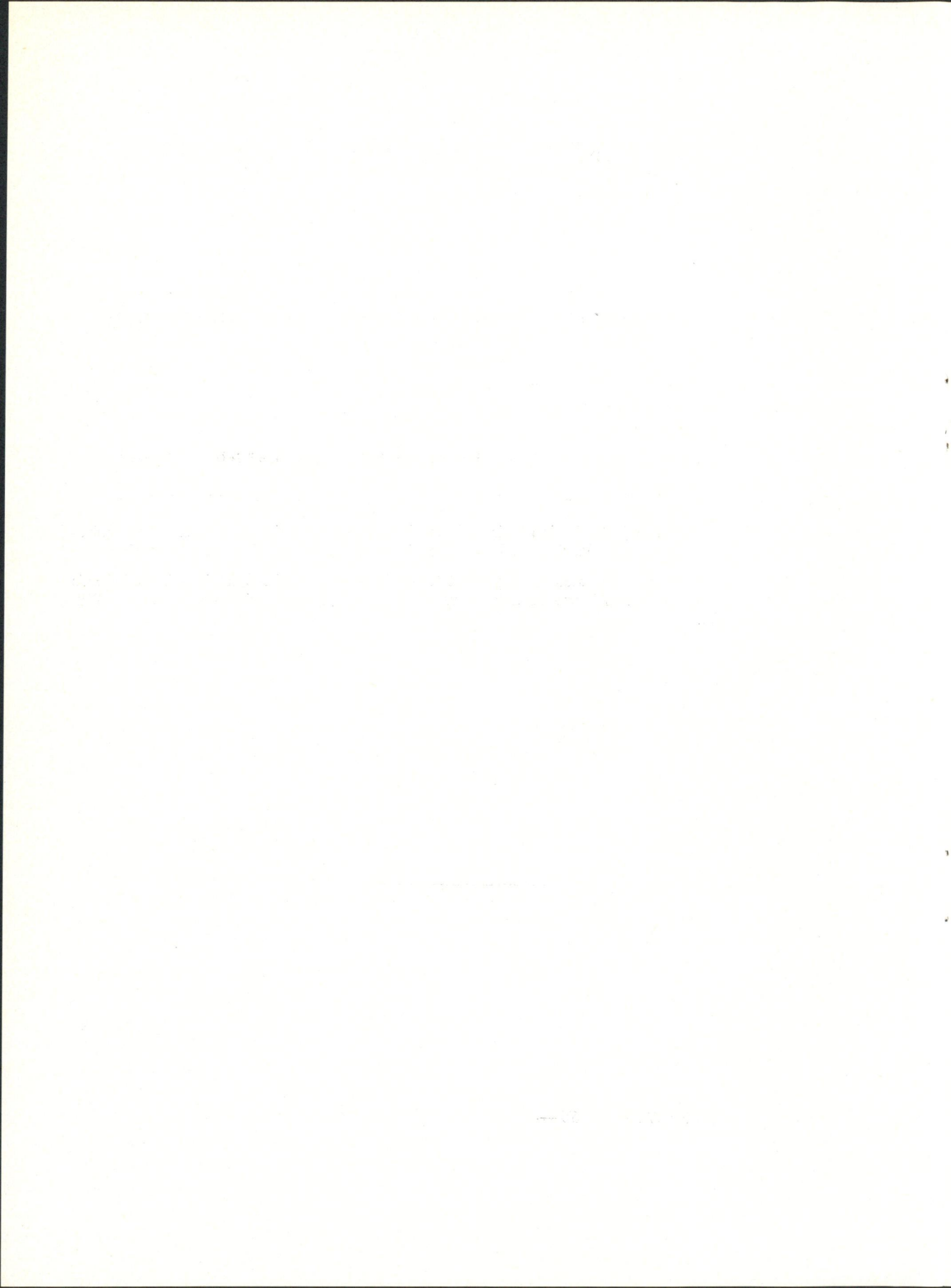
EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

This Bill is cognate with the Conveyancing (Amendment) Bill, 1984.

The object of this Bill is to insert into the Constitution Act, 1902, the requirement that Acts of Parliament be enrolled in the office of the Registrar-General.

That requirement is at present found in section 6 of the Registration of Deeds Act, 1897, which is proposed to be repealed by the Conveyancing (Amendment) Bill, 1984.

A BILL FOR

An Act to amend the Constitution Act, 1902, with respect to the enrolment of Acts of Parliament, consequent upon the repeal of the Registration of Deeds Act, 1897.

Constitution (Enrolment of Acts) Amendment.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Constitution (Enrolment of Acts) Amendment Act, 1984".

Commencement.

2. (1) Sections 1 and 2 shall commence on the date of assent to this
10 Act.

(2) Except as provided by subsection (1), this Act shall commence on the day appointed and notified under section 2 (3) of the Conveyancing (Amendment) Act, 1984.

Amendment of Act No. 32, 1902.

15 3. The Constitution Act, 1902, is amended in the manner set forth in Schedule 1.
