# **INCLOSED LANDS PROTECTION (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1983**


### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

This Bill is cognate with the Offences in Public Places (Amendment) Bill, 1983.

The object of this Bill is to amend section 4A of the Inclosed Lands Protection Act, 1901, so as—

- (a) to make it an offence for a person, who remains upon inclosed lands after being requested to leave, to conduct himself or herself in such a manner as would be regarded by reasonable persons as being, in all the circumstances, offensive; and
- (b) to cast expressly on a person accused of such an offence the onus of establishing that the person had a reasonable excuse.

### A BILL FOR

An Act to amend the Inclosed Lands Protection Act, 1901, with respect to offensive conduct upon certain inclosed land.

**BE** it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

#### 5 Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Inclosed Lands Protection (Amendment) Act, 1983".

#### Commencement.

- 2. (1) Sections 1 and 2 shall commence on the date of assent to this Act.
- 10 (2) Except as provided by subsection (1), this Act shall commence on such day as may be appointed by the Governor in respect thereof and as may be notified by proclamation published in the Gazette.

### Amendment of Act No. 33, 1901.

3. The Inclosed Lands Protection Act, 1901, is amended in the manner 15 set forth in Schedule 1.






