LEGAL SERVICES COMMISSION (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1983

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

This Bill is cognate with the Arbitration (Civil Actions) Bill, 1983.

The object of this Bill is to amend the Legal Services Commission Act, 1979, as a consequence of the provision by the proposed Arbitration (Civil Actions) Act, 1983, of a procedure by way of rehearing instead of by way of appeal.

An Act to amend section 47 of the Legal Services Commission Act, 1979,
with respect to the rehearing of certain matters.

Legal Services Commission (Amendment).

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Legal Services Commission (Amendment) Act, 1983".

Commencement.

2. (1) Except as provided by subsection (2), this Act shall commence 10 on the date of assent to this Act.

(2) Section 3 and Schedule 1 shall commence on the day appointed and notified under section 2 (2) of the Arbitration (Civil Actions) Act, 1983.

Amendment of Act No. 78, 1979.

15 3. The Legal Services Commission Act, 1979, is amended in the manner set forth in Schedule 1.
