## **MOTOR VEHICLE REPAIRS (DANGEROUS GOODS) AMENDMENT BILL, 1982**

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### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

**(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)**

This Bill is cognate with the Dangerous Goods (Amendment) Bill, 1982.

The object of this Bill is to amend the Motor Vehicle Repairs Act, 1980, so as—

- (a) to include within the operation of that Act certain trades relating to the installation and repair of liquefied petroleum gas and natural gas equipment (Schedule 1 (1));
  - (b) to prohibit the carrying out of work relating to the installation and repair of liquefied petroleum gas and natural gas equipment by any person who is not the holder of a tradesman's certificate granted under that Act in respect of that work (Schedule 1 (4)); and
  - (c) to make other provisions of a consequential or ancillary nature.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

(a) to amend the Motor Vehicle Repairs Act, 1980, so as—

to include within the operation of that Act certain trades relating to the installation and repair of liquid petroleum gas and natural gas equipment (Schedule 1 (1));

(b) to prohibit the carrying out of work relating to the installation and repair of liquid petroleum gas and natural gas equipment by any person who is not the holder of a technician's certificate granted under that Act in respect of that work (Schedule 1 (4)); and

(c) to make other provisions of a consequential or ancillary nature.

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**BE** it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

**5 Short title.**

1. This Act may be cited as the "Motor Vehicle Repairs (Dangerous Goods) Amendment Act, 1982".

**Commencement.**

2. (1) This section and section 1 shall commence on the date of assent to 10 this Act.

(2) Except as provided in subsection (1), this Act shall commence on the day appointed and notified pursuant to section 2 (2) of the Dangerous Goods (Amendment) Act, 1982.

An Act to amend the Motor Vehicle Repairs Act, 1980, so as to extend the operation of that Act to certain trades relating to the installation and repair of liquefied petroleum gas and natural gas equipment, and for other purposes. [Assented to, 12th May, 1982.]

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**BE** it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

**Short title.**

1. This Act may be cited as the "Motor Vehicle Repairs (Dangerous Goods) Amendment Act, 1982".

**Commencement.**

2. (1) This section and section 1 shall commence on the date of assent to this Act.

(2) Except as provided in subsection (1), this Act shall commence on the day appointed and notified pursuant to section 2 (2) of the Dangerous Goods (Amendment) Act, 1982.

(2A) On or after the relevant day, no person (other than an exempted person) shall personally do the work of a liquefied petroleum gas mechanic or a natural gas mechanic unless he holds a tradesman's certificate in respect of a class of repair work that includes the work of a liquefied petroleum gas mechanic or a natural gas mechanic, as the case may be.

Penalty: \$2,000.

(5) Section 24 (1A)—

After section 24 (1), insert:—

(1A) The Council may grant a tradesman's certificate in respect of more than 1 class of repair work.
