SPORTING INJURIES INSURANCE (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1983

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

The object of this Bill is to increase the amounts of benefits payable under the Sporting Injuries Insurance Act, 1978 ("the Principal Act"), as follows:—

- (a) by Schedule 1 (1)-
 - (i) to increase the supplementary benefit under section 25 (2) (a) of the Principal Act for quadriplegia or paraplegia to \$14,650;
 - (ii) to increase the minimum benefit under section 25 (2) (b) of the Principal Act for certain cases of loss of sight involving both eyes to \$21,000;
 - (iii) to increase the maximum benefit referred to in section 25 (3) of the Principal Act payable within 3 months of the incident which caused an injury to \$37,500; and
 - (iv) to increase the maximum benefit referred to in section 25 (5) of the Principal Act for injuries from a single incident to \$90,000;
- (b) by Schedule 1 (2)—
 - (i) to increase the benefit under section 26 (2) (a) of the Principal Act for death to \$37,500 and \$1,500 for each dependent child; and
 - (ii) to increase the maximum benefit referred to in section 26 (4) (b) of the Principal Act for death (including preceding injuries) to \$90,000; and
- (c) by Schedule 1 (3)—to increase the benefits under Schedule 1 to the Principal Act to the respective amounts set out in the new Schedule to be inserted by the proposed Act.

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Sporting Injuries Insurance (Amendment).

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:---

5 Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Sporting Injuries Insurance (Amendment) Act, 1983".

Commencement.

2. (1) Sections 1 and 2 shall commence on the date of assent to this 10 Act.

(2) Except as provided by subsection (1), this Act shall commence on such day as may be appointed by the Governor in respect thereof and as may be notified by proclamation published in the Gazette.

Principal Act.

15 3. The Sporting Injuries Insurance Act, 1978, is referred to in this Act as the Principal Act.

Amendment of Act No. 141, 1978.

4. The Principal Act is amended in the manner set forth in Schedule 1.

Transitional provisions.

20 5. (1) The Principal Act applies to and in respect of injury or death arising out of or in the course of sporting or athletic activities which took place before the day appointed and notified under section 2 (2) as if this Act had not been enacted.

Sporting Injuries Insurance (Amendment).

(2) Nothing in this Act affects any regulations in force under the Principal Act immediately before the day appointed and notified under section 2 (2).
