STOCK DISEASES (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1982

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

The object of this Bill is to amend the Stock Diseases Act, 1923—

- (a) to require cattle, swine or other stock that are sent to a saleyard or abattoir outside New South Wales for sale or slaughter to be identified in the same manner as would be required if they were to be sold or slaughtered within the State (Schedule 1); and
- (b) to provide for the appointment to the Board of Tick Control of a person elected by the staff establishment of that Board (Schedule 2).

The Bill also contains provisions of a saving and transitional nature (Schedule 3).

STOCK EXCHANGE (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1932

(This is a copy of the Bill as introduced into the House.)

The object of this Bill is to amend the Stock Exchange Act, 1926—

(a) to require the name of every stock that is sold to a subscriber or to a transferee of a share of stock to be identified in the same manner as would be required if the share were to be sold or transferred within the state (Schedule 1); and

(b) to provide for the appointment to the Board of Tick Control of a person elected by the staff of the Board (Schedule 2).

The Bill also contains provisions of a saving and transitional nature (Schedule

3).

A BILL FOR

An Act to amend the Stock Diseases Act, 1923, with respect to the identification of stock and the constitution of the Board of Tick Control.

Stock Diseases (Amendment).

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Stock Diseases (Amendment) Act, 1982".

Commencement.

2. (1) Except as provided by subsection (2), this Act shall commence 10 on the date of assent to this Act.

(2) Section 5, in its application to Schedule 2, and Schedule 2 shall commence on such day as may be appointed by the Governor in respect thereof and as may be notified by proclamation published in the Gazette.

Principal Act.

15 3. The Stock Diseases Act, 1923, is referred to in this Act as the Principal Act.

An Act to amend the Stock Diseases Act, 1923, with respect to the identification of stock and the constitution of the Board of Tick Control.
[Assented to, 20th May, 1982.]

Stock Diseases (Amendment).

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Stock Diseases (Amendment) Act, 1982".

Commencement.
