SUNDAY ENTERTAINMENT (REPEAL) BILL, 1983

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

The Theatres and Public Halls (Amendment) Bill, 1983, is cognate with this Bill.

The object of this Bill is to repeal the Sunday Entertainment Act, 1966.

Sunday Entertainment (Repeal).

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Sunday Entertainment (Repeal) Act, 1983".

Repeal of Act No. 17, 1966, etc.

2. (1) The Sunday Entertainment Act, 1966, is repealed.

10 (2) So much of Schedule 2 to the Liquor (Repeals and Savings) Act, 1982, as amends the Sunday Entertainment Act, 1966, is repealed.

Savings.

3. (1) The repeal of the Sunday Entertainment Act, 1966, by this Act does not affect any amendment to section 4 of the Theatres and Public Halls Act, 1908, made by the Sunday Entertainment Act, 1966, and any such amendment continues to have force and effect as if the Sunday Entertainment Act, 1966, had not been repealed.

(2) The repeal of the Sunday Entertainment Act, 1966, by this Act does not revive any Imperial Act referred to in section 7 of the Sunday Entertainment Act, 1966.

Sunday Entertainment (Repeal).

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Sunday Entertainment (Repeal) Act, 1983".

Repeal of Act No. 17, 1966, etc.

2. (1) The Sunday Entertainment Act, 1966, is repealed.

(2) So much of Schedule 2 to the Liquor (Repeals and Savings) Act, 1982, as amends the Sunday Entertainment Act, 1966, is repealed.

Savings.

3. (1) The repeal of the Sunday Entertainment Act, 1966, by this Act does not affect any amendment to section 4 of the Theatres and Public Halls Act, 1908, made by the Sunday Entertainment Act, 1966, and any such amendment continues to have force and effect as if the Sunday Entertainment Act, 1966, had not been repealed.

(2) The repeal of the Sunday Entertainment Act, 1966, by this Act does not revive any Imperial Act referred to in section 7 of the Sunday Entertainment Act, 1966.
