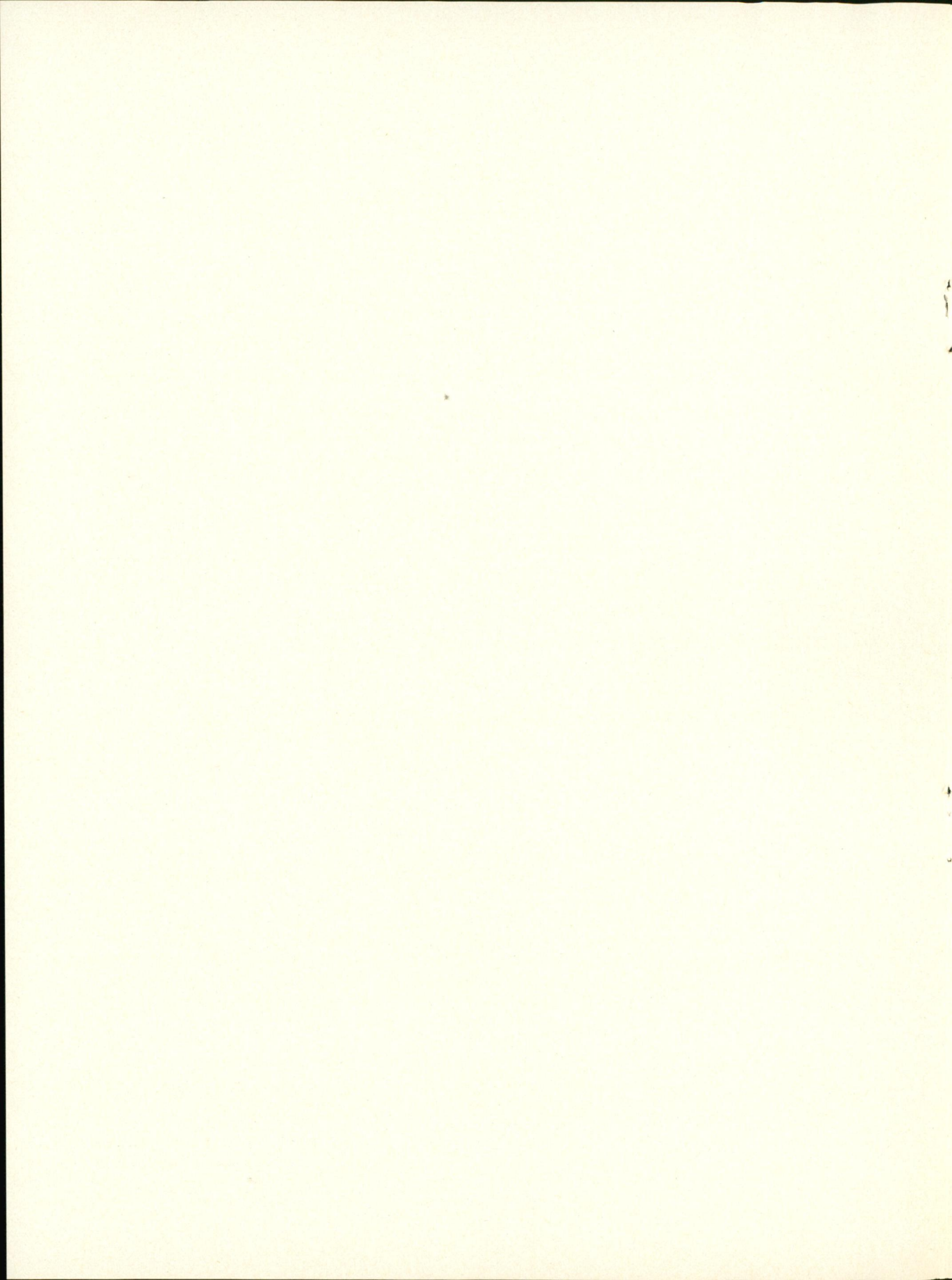
SWINE COMPENSATION (MEAT INSPECTION) AMENDMENT BILL, 1983

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

This Bill is cognate with the Commonwealth Powers (Meat Inspection) Bill, 1983.

The object of this Bill is to amend the Swine Compensation Act, 1928, to provide for compensation to be payable in respect of pigs ordered to be destroyed by inspectors under the Stock Diseases Act, 1923, and Commonwealth meat inspectors.

A BILL FOR

An Act to amend section 5 of the Swine Compensation Act, 1928, in relation to orders given by inspectors under the Stock Diseases Act, 1923, and Commonwealth meat inspectors for the destruction of pigs.

Swine Compensation (Meat Inspection) Amendment.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Swine Compensation (Meat Inspection) Amendment Act, 1983".

Commencement.

2. (1) Except as provided by subsection (2), this Act shall commence
10 on the date of assent to this Act.

(2) Section 3 shall commence on the day appointed and notified under section 2 (2) of the Stock Diseases (Meat Inspection) Amendment Act, 1983.

Amendment of Act No. 36, 1928.

15 **3.** The Swine Compensation Act, 1928, is amended by omitting section 5 (2) and by inserting instead the following subsection:—

(2) For the purposes of subsection (1) (c), "approved person" means—

(a) an inspector under the Stock Diseases Act, 1923;

20 (b) an employee under an Act of the Parliament of the Commonwealth who, in his capacity as such, engages in the inspection of meat; or

- (c) a person approved for the time being by the Minister for the purposes of this Act, either generally or in a particular case, and who is a veterinary surgeon, within the meaning of the Veterinary Surgeons Act, 1923, or a person employed as a veterinary surgeon under an Act of the Parliament of the Commonwealth.
