**CINEMATOGRAPH FILMS (FURTHER SUSPENSION)
BILL, 1985**

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

The objects of this Bill are—

- (a) to continue the suspension (effected by the Cinematograph Films (Suspension of Provisions) Act, 1982) of operation of the Cinematograph Films Act, 1935, for a further period of not less than 2 years; and
 - (b) to provide for the revival of the Cinematograph Films Act, 1935, or for the repeal of that Act and certain other enactments, at the end of that further period.

A BILL FOR

An Act to continue the suspension of operation of the Cinematograph Films Act, 1935, for a further period, to provide for the revival or repeal of that Act at the end of that further period and for other purposes.

Cinematograph Films (Further Suspension) 1985

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Cinematograph Films (Further Suspension) Act, 1985".

Suspension of operation of Act No. 41, 1935.

2. The provisions of the Cinematograph Films Act, 1935—

- 10 (a) shall be deemed to have had no effect during the period commencing on 21st December, 1984, and ending immediately before the date of assent to this Act; and
- (b) shall have no effect during the period commencing on the date of assent to this Act and ending immediately before the day
- 15 appointed by a proclamation under section 3.

Proclamation.

3. (1) The Governor, by proclamation published in the Gazette, may either—

- 20 (a) declare that the provisions of the Cinematograph Films Act, 1935, shall have effect on and from a day appointed by the proclamation; or
- (b) declare each Act specified in Schedule 1, to the extent specified in that Schedule, to be repealed on a day appointed by the proclamation.

25 (2) The day appointed by a proclamation under this section shall be a day—

- (a) not earlier than 21st December, 1986; and

(b) not earlier than the day on which the proclamation is published in the Gazette.

(3) A proclamation under this section shall have effect according to its tenor.

5 Savings.

4. A contract relating to the hiring of films which was entered into before 21st December, 1982, and which was affected by the provisions of section 11B of the Cinematograph Films Act, 1935, continues to be so affected as if this Act had not been enacted.

Cinematograph Films (Further Suspension) 1985

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Cinematograph Films (Further Suspension) Act, 1985".

Suspension of operation of Act No. 41, 1935.

2. The provisions of the Cinematograph Films Act, 1935—

- (a) shall be deemed to have had no effect during the period commencing on 21st December, 1984, and ending immediately before the date of assent to this Act; and
- (b) shall have no effect during the period commencing on the date of assent to this Act and ending immediately before the day appointed by a proclamation under section 3.

Proclamation.

3. (1) The Governor, by proclamation published in the Gazette, may either—

- (a) declare that the provisions of the Cinematograph Films Act, 1935, shall have effect on and from a day appointed by the proclamation; or
- (b) declare each Act specified in Schedule 1, to the extent specified in that Schedule, to be repealed on a day appointed by the proclamation.

(2) The day appointed by a proclamation under this section shall be a day—

- (a) not earlier than 21st December, 1986; and

(b) not earlier than the day on which the proclamation is published in the Gazette.

(3) A proclamation under this section shall have effect according to its tenor.

Savings.

4. A contract relating to the hiring of films which was entered into before 21st December, 1982, and which was affected by the provisions of section 11B of the Cinematograph Films Act, 1935, continues to be so affected as if this Act had not been enacted.
