CRIMES (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1985

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

This Bill is cognate with the Second-hand Dealers and Collectors (Amendment) Bill, 1985.

The object of this Bill is to amend the Crimes Act, 1900, so as-

- (a) to remove the requirement in the offence of stealing property from a dwellinghouse that the property be of \$10 or more in value (Schedule 1 (1));
- (b) to increase the fine that may be imposed on persons convicted of being unlawfully in possession of property from \$400 to \$500 (Schedule 1 (2)); and
- (c) to increase from \$500 to \$2,000 the value of stolen property in respect of the receipt of which a person may be punishable summarily (Schedule 1 (3)).
