EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

This Bill is cognate with the Mental Health (Amendment) Bill 1986.

The object of this Bill is to clarify the procedures under the Crimes Act 1900, as to be amended by the Crimes (Mental Disorder) Amendment Act 1983, in accordance with which magistrates may deal with defendants who are mentally disabled.

Clause 1 specifies the short title of the proposed Act.

Clause 2 provides that the proposed Act will, with minor exceptions, commence on the day on which proposed Part XIA (Unfitness to be Tried for an Offence) of the Crimes Act 1900, as to be inserted by the Crimes (Mental Disorder) Amendment Act 1983, commences.

Clause 3 is a formal provision which gives effect to the Schedule of amendments.

Schedule 1 (1) inserts a definition of "mental condition" into proposed Part XIA of the Crimes Act 1900.

Schedule 1 (2) substitutes for the expression "mentally disordered" in proposed section 428w of the Crimes Act 1900 the expressions "suffering from a mental illness" and "suffering from a mental condition for which treatment is available in a hospital" so as to facilitate the exercise of a magistrate's discretion under the proposed section.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Crimes (Mental Illness) Amendment Act 1986".

Commencement

2. (1) Sections 1 and 2 shall commence on the date of assent to this 10 Act.

(2) Except as provided by subsection (1), this Act shall commence on the day appointed and notified under section 2 (3) of the Crimes (Mental Disorder) Amendment Act 1983 in respect of Schedule 1 (3) to that Act.
