**FOREIGN JUDGMENTS (RECIPROCAL ENFORCEMENT)
(COMMERCIAL ARBITRATION) AMENDMENT BILL, 1984**

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

This Bill is cognate with the Commercial Arbitration Bill, 1984.

The object of this Bill is to amend the definition of "judgment" in section 4 (1) of the Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) Act, 1973, so as to exclude from that definition a "foreign award" within the meaning of the Commercial Arbitration Bill, 1984 (Part VII of that Bill deals with the recognition and enforcement of foreign awards).

A BILL FOR

An Act to amend the Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) Act, 1973, in relation to the application of that Act to certain foreign arbitral awards.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) (Commercial Arbitration) Amendment Act, 1984".

Commencement.

2. (1) Sections 1 and 2 shall commence on the date of assent to this Act.

10 (2) Except as provided by subsection (1), this Act shall commence on such day as may be appointed by the Governor in respect thereof and as may be notified by proclamation published in the Gazette.

Amendment of Act No. 39, 1973.

15 3. The Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) Act, 1973, is amended by inserting in the definition of "judgment" in section 4 (1) after the word "arbitration" the words "(other than a 'foreign award' within the meaning of section 56 (1) of the Commercial Arbitration Act, 1984)".

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) (Commercial Arbitration) Amendment Act, 1984".
