EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

The object of this Bill is to enable certain Parliamentary Committees to function during the next prorogation of Parliament and during the second session of the present Parliament.

A BILL FOR

An Act to enable certain Committees of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly to function during the prorogation of Parliament and during the second session of the forty-eighth Parliament.

[MR WRAN—23 *May*, 1984]

Parliamentary Committees Enabling.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Parliamentary Committees Enabling Act, 1984".

Power to function for an extended period.

2. (1) It is hereby declared that the Parliamentary Committees
10 mentioned in Schedule 1 may—

(a) lawfully sit during the period commencing on the termination of the first session of the forty-eighth Parliament and ending on the termination of the second session of that Parliament; and

15 (b) lawfully do during that period all such things as they might lawfully have done had the first session of that Parliament continued throughout that period.

(2) Nothing in subsection (1) shall affect or alter any power of the Legislative Council or Legislative Assembly, and it is hereby declared that the operation of that subsection is subject to any such power and the exercise

Act No. 42, 1984.

An Act to enable certain Committees of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly to function during the prorogation of Parliament and during the second session of the forty-eighth Parliament. [Assented to, 13th June, 1984.]

Parliamentary Committees Enabling.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Parliamentary Committees Enabling Act, 1984".

Power to function for an extended period.

2. (1) It is hereby declared that the Parliamentary Committees mentioned in Schedule 1 may—

- (a) lawfully sit during the period commencing on the termination of the first session of the forty-eighth Parliament and ending on the termination of the second session of that Parliament; and
- (b) lawfully do during that period all such things as they might lawfully have done had the first session of that Parliament continued throughout that period.

(2) Nothing in subsection (1) shall affect or alter any power of the Legislative Council or Legislative Assembly, and it is hereby declared that the operation of that subsection is subject to any such power and the exercise thereof.
