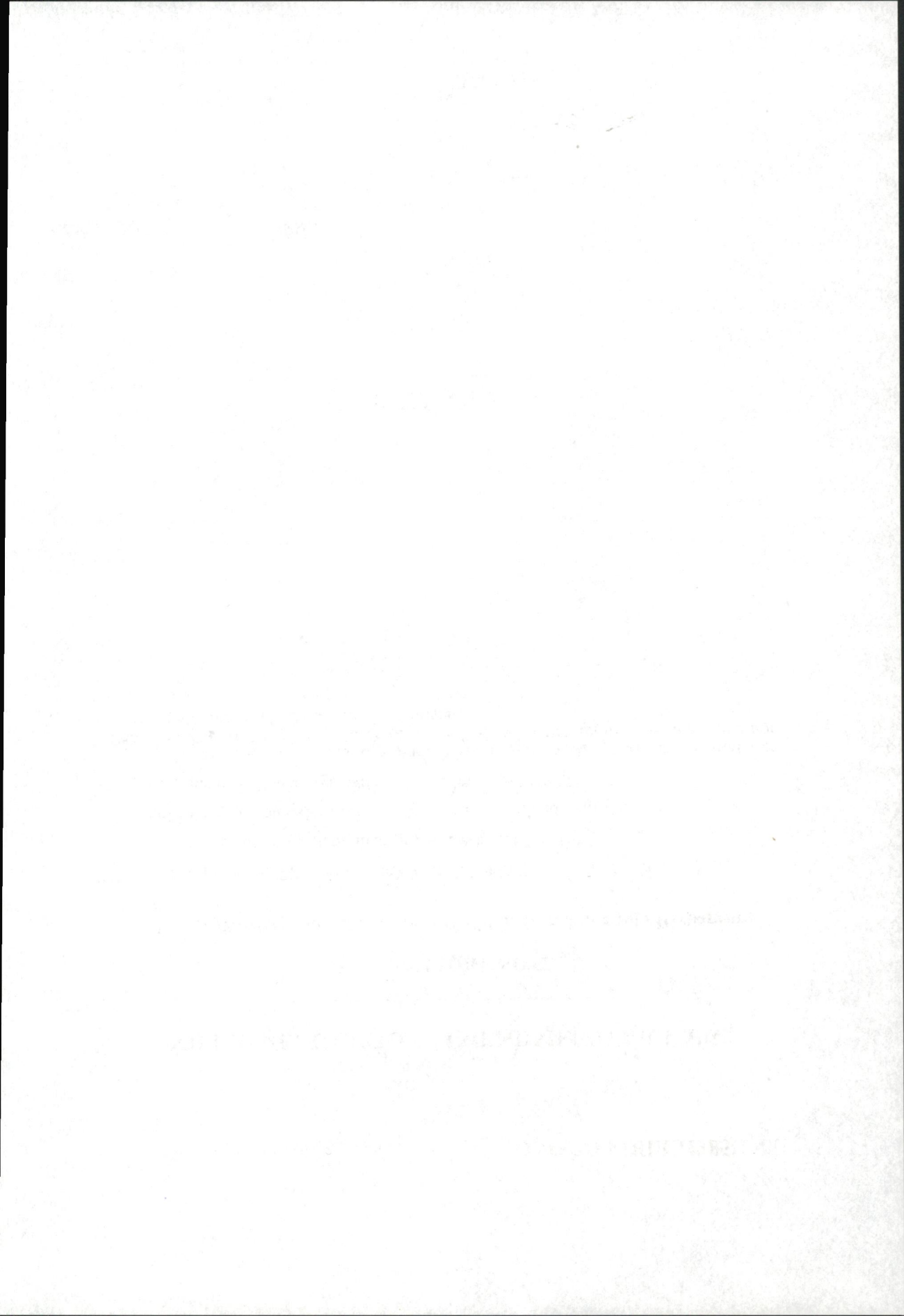
The following Bills are cognate with this Bill:

The object of this Bill is to provide that a Deputy or Assistant Commissioner of Police may retire between the ages of 55 and 60, with the approval of the Governor given on the recommendation of the Minister.

Police Regulation (Amendment) 1985

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

5 Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the "Police Regulation (Amendment) Act 1985".

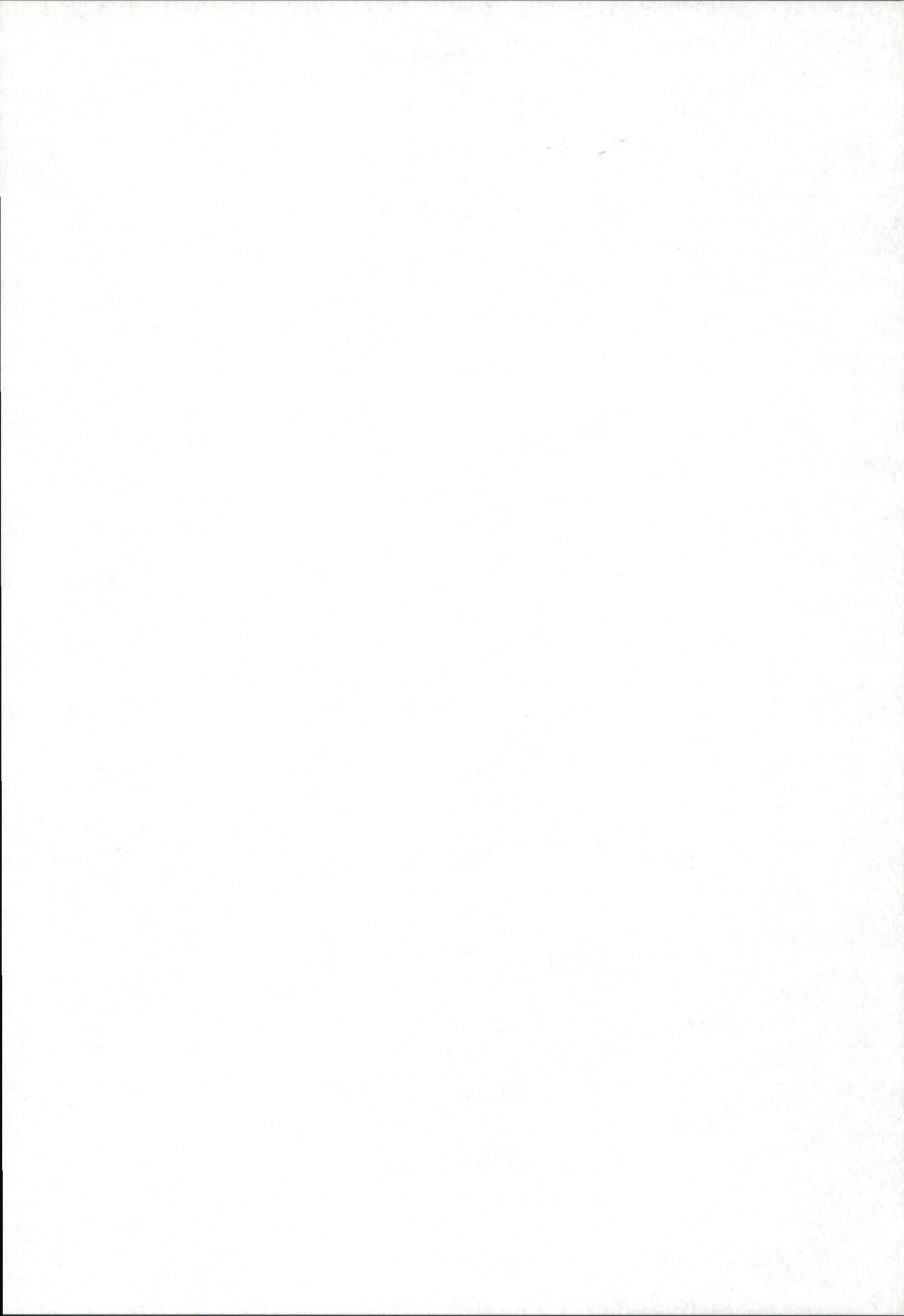

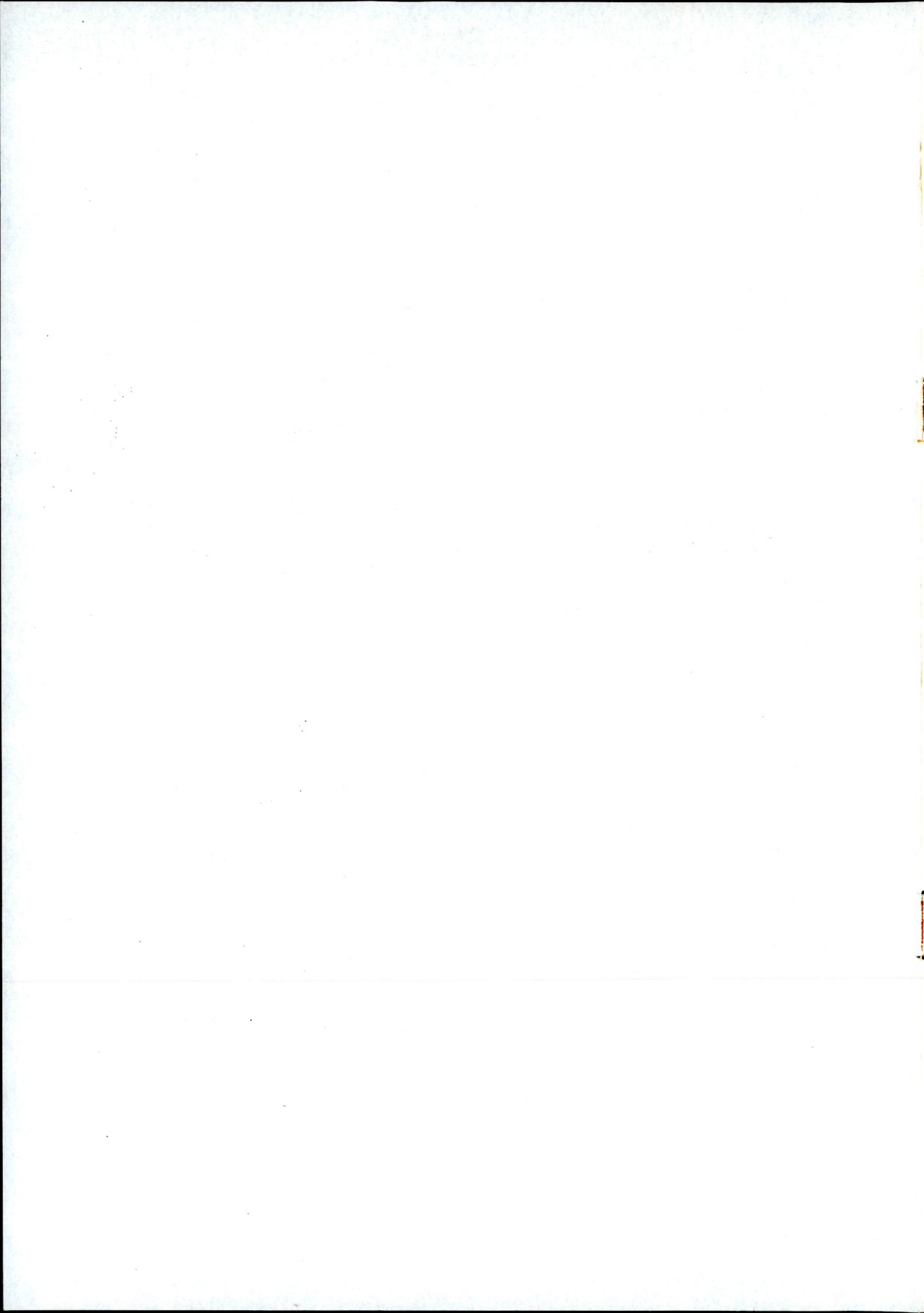

Police Regulation (Amendment) 1985
