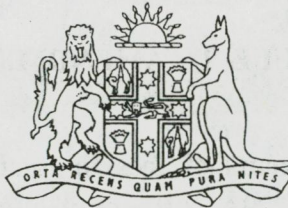

Act No. 16, 1991

An Act to amend the Local Government Act 1919 to change the date on which ordinary elections for local councils are to be held. [Assented to 3 May 1991]

Local Government (Elections) Amendment 1991

The Legislature of New South Wales enacts:

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Local Government (Elections) Amendment Act 1991.

Commencement

2. This Act commences on the date of assent.

Amendment of Local Government Act 1919 No. 41

3. The Local Government Act 1919 is amended as set out in Schedule 1.

SCHEDULE 1—AMENDMENTS

(Sec. 3)

(1) Section 29A (**Payments of fees to members**):

From section 29A (2), omit "fourth", insert instead "second".

(2) Section 39 (**Appointed day for election of aldermen or councillors**):

Omit section 39 (1) (a) and (b), insert instead:

(a) for the ordinary election in the year 1991—the second Saturday in September;

(b) for ordinary elections after the year 1991—the second Saturday in September in every fourth year thereafter;

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

The object of this Bill is to change the date for ordinary elections for local councils to the second Saturday in September in every fourth year.

Clause 1 specifies the short title of the proposed Act.

Clause 2 provides for the proposed Act to commence on the date of assent.

Clause 3 gives effect to the Schedule of amendments.

Schedule 1 amends the Local Government Act 1919 to change the date for ordinary elections of aldermen and councillors to the second Saturday in September in every fourth year commencing 1991. At present, these elections are required to be held on the fourth Saturday in September.

Local Government (Elections) Amendment 1991

The Legislature of New South Wales enacts:

Short title

Commencement
