

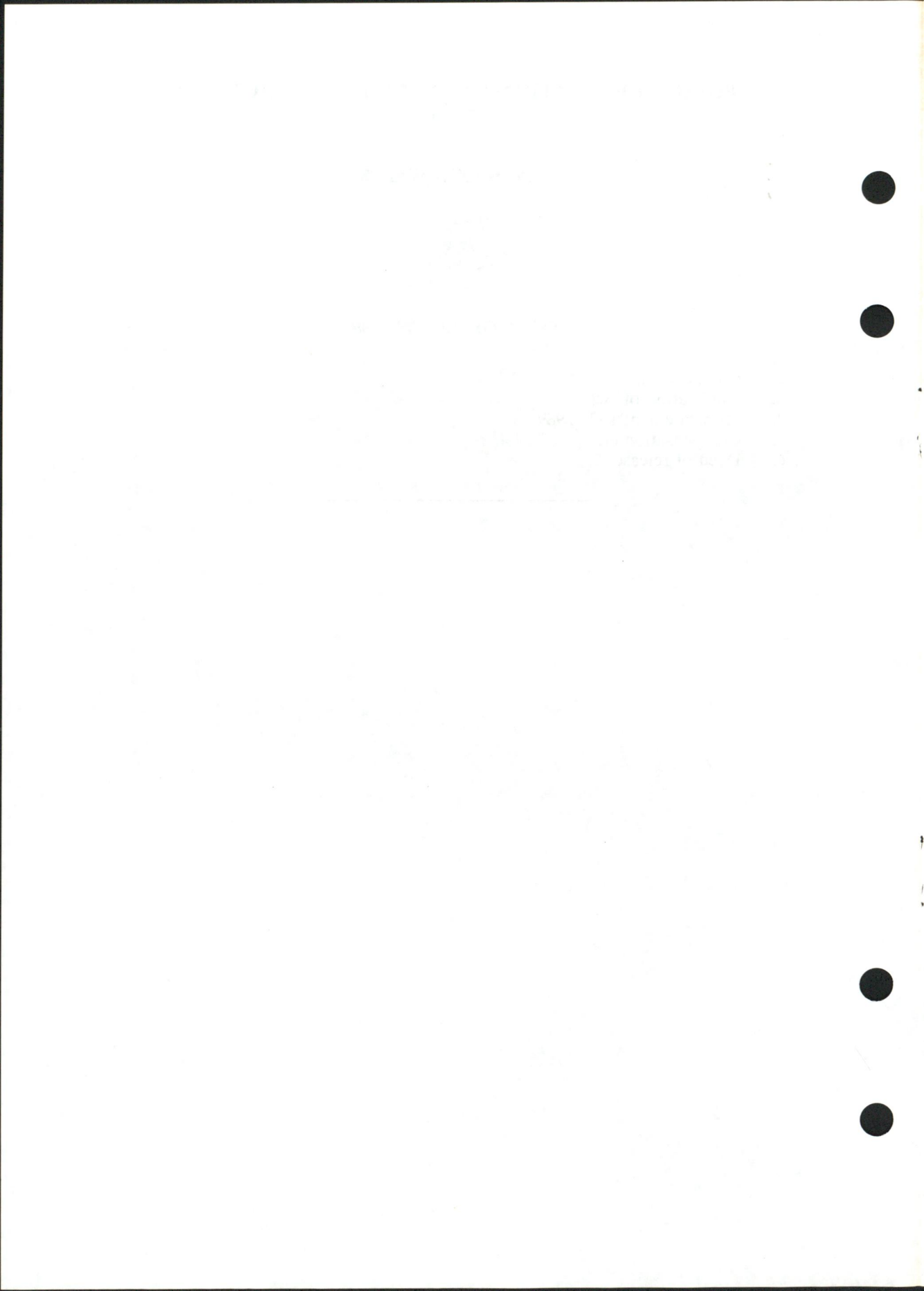

Act No. 145, 1989

An Act to make special provisions for the reinstatement of Mr. Philip Neville Arantz as a member of the Police Force and for associated purposes. [Assented to 25 October 1989]

The Legislature of New South Wales enacts:

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Police Regulation (Reinstatement) Act 1989.

Commencement

2. This Act commences on a day or days to be appointed by proclamation.

Application of Act

3. This Act applies in relation to Mr. Philip Neville Arantz, who was appointed as a Probationary Constable in the Police Force on 30 November 1948.

Reinstatement 1971-1989

4. (1) Mr. Arantz shall be taken to have been a member of the Police Force during the period commencing on 7 December 1971 and ending immediately before the commencement of this section.

(2) The dismissal of Mr. Arantz from the Police Force with effect from 7 December 1971 is revoked.

(3) Mr. Arantz shall be taken to have retired from the Police Force immediately before the commencement of this section, with effect from that commencement.

(4) As soon as possible after the commencement of this Act, the official record sheet held by the Commissioner of Police in respect of Mr. Arantz shall be altered to expunge any notation of the following matters relating to Mr. Arantz:

- (a) charges of misconduct and disobedience on or after 27 September 1971, and the subject-matter of the charges;
- (b) suspension from pay and duty;
- (c) dismissal from the Police Force.

Compensation etc.

5. (1) Nothing in this Act affects any compensation paid to Mr. Arantz before the commencement of this section.

Police Regulation (Reinstatement) 1989

(2) The compensation paid to Mr. Arantz before the commencement of this section shall be taken to be full compensation in respect of:

- (a) the matters mentioned in section 4 (4); and
- (b) matters relating to the operation of this Act; and
- (c) any connected matters,

and accordingly no further compensation and no damages are payable in respect of any of those matters.

(3) Mr. Arantz does not have, and is to be taken not to have had, any rights or entitlements (including but not limited to rights or entitlements to remuneration, allowances or other payments or to leave) as a member of the Police Force in respect of any period commencing on or after 7 December 1971.

(4) The Police Regulation (Superannuation) Act 1906 does not apply to Mr. Arantz as a member of the Police Force in respect of any period commencing on or after 7 December 1971.

Deed of release

6. Clause 2 of the deed executed by Mr. Arantz in relation to his dismissal from the Police Force and dated 1 February 1985 is cancelled and has no effect, but otherwise the deed continues to have effect.

POLICE REGULATION (REINSTATEMENT) BILL 1989

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

The objects of this Bill are to revoke the dismissal of Mr. Philip Neville Arantz as a member of the Police Force and to reinstate him from the time of his dismissal to the commencement of the proposed legislation.

Clause 1 specifies the short title of the proposed Act.

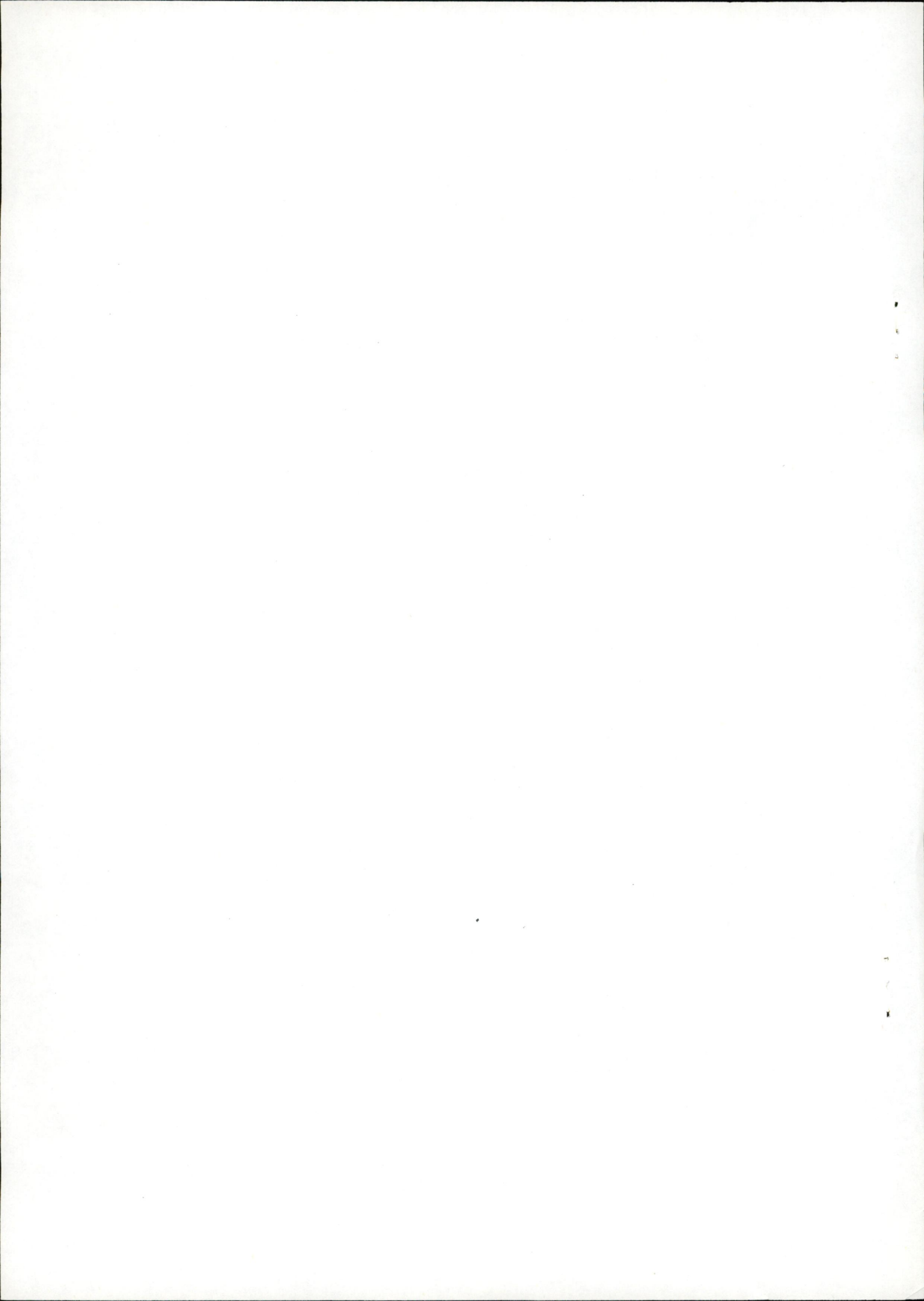
Clause 2 provides for the proposed Act to commence by proclamation.

Clause 3 identifies the person to whom the proposed Act applies.

Clause 4 reinstates Mr. Arantz as a member of the Police Force from the time of his dismissal (effective 7 December 1971) to the commencement of the proposed clause. For this purpose, his dismissal is revoked as from that date, and he is treated as having retired at the commencement of the proposed clause. The clause also requires his record sheet to be altered by expunging notations of charges against him and his suspension and dismissal.

Clause 5 provides that nothing in the proposed Act affects compensation already paid to Mr. Arantz, that compensation being regarded as full compensation for his suspension, dismissal and associated matters. The clause also provides that he is not entitled to remuneration, pension etc. in connection with the period of his reinstatement.

Clause 6 revokes clause 2 of the deed of release executed by Mr. Arantz (which prevented the making of complaints, statements, comments and disclosures by him).



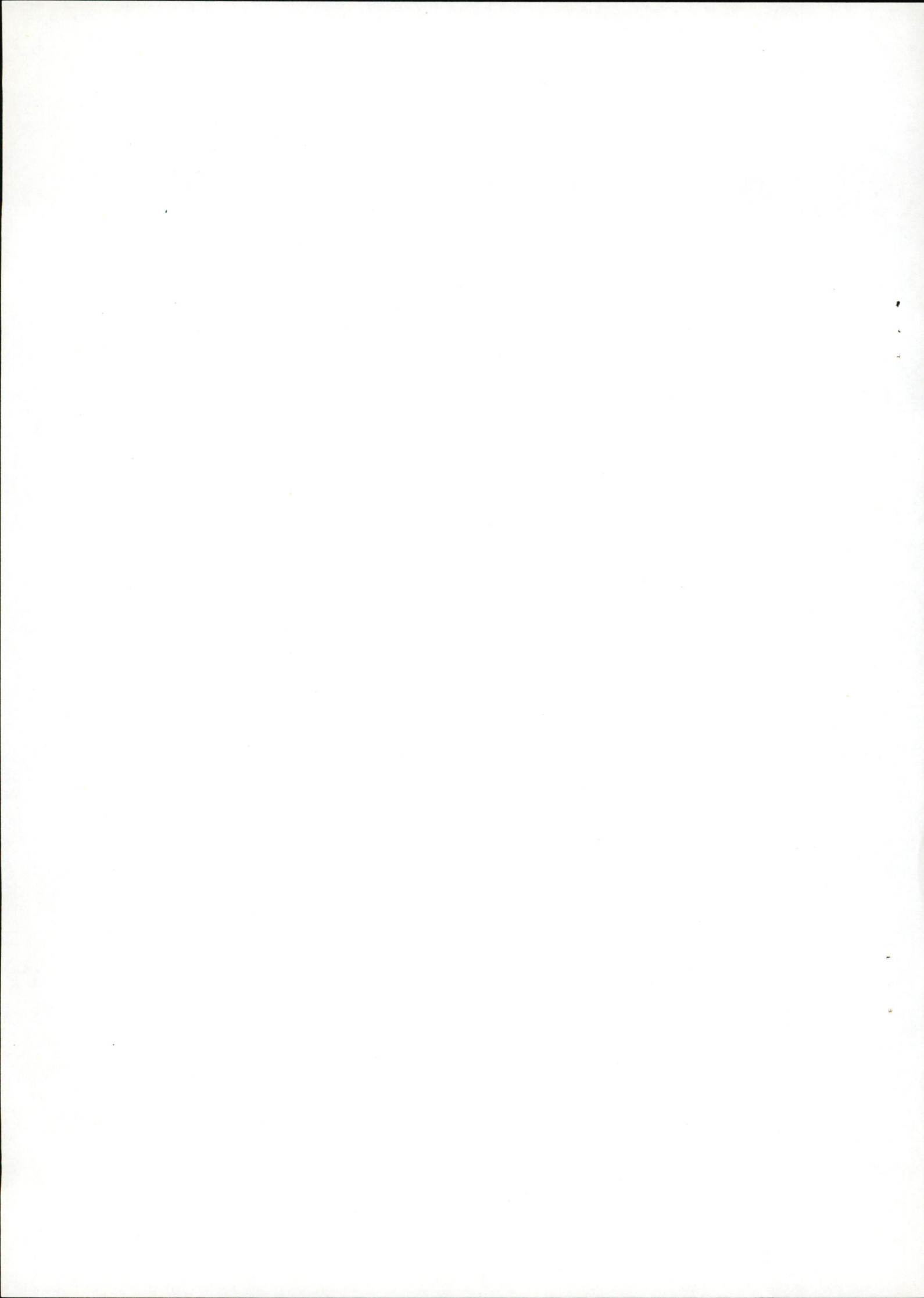
