EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

The object of this Bill is to amend the Standard Time Act 1987 to provide that daylight saving is to finish on the first Sunday in March in each year instead of the third Sunday.

Clause 1 specifies the short title of the proposed Act.

Clause 2 provides for the proposed Act to commence on assent.

Clause 3 effects the amendment mentioned above.

Clause 4 makes it clear that the amendment applies to the current period of daylight saving as well as to future periods.

A BILL FOR

An Act to amend the Standard Time Act 1987 in relation to the length of summer time periods.

The Legislature of New South Wales enacts:

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Standard Time (Amendment) Act 1988.

Commencement

5 2. This Act commences on the date of assent.

Amendment of Standard Time Act 1987 No. 149, s. 2 (Definitions)

3. The Standard Time Act 1987 is amended by omitting from the definition of "summer time period" in section 2 the words "third Sunday" and by inserting instead the words "first Sunday".

10 Application of amendment

4. The amendment made by this Act applies to the summer time period that commenced on 30 October 1988, as well as to later summer time periods.





An Act to amend the Standard Time Act 1987 in relation to the length of summer time periods. [Assented to 18 January 1989]

The Legislature of New South Wales enacts:

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Standard Time (Amendment) Act 1988.

Commencement

2. This Act commences on the date of assent.

Amendment of Standard Time Act 1987 No. 149, s. 2 (Definitions)

3. The Standard Time Act 1987 is amended by omitting from the definition of "summer time period" in section 2 the words "third Sunday" and by inserting instead the words "first Sunday".

Application of amendment

4. The amendment made by this Act applies to the summer time period that commenced on 30 October 1988, as well as to later summer time periods.
