Act No. 175, 1989

An Act to amend the Warehousemen's Liens Act 1935 in relation to the sale of goods under that Act. [Assented to 14 December 1989]

The Legislature of New South Wales enacts:

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Warehousemen's Liens (Amendment) Act 1989.

Commencement

2. This Act commences on a day to be appointed by proclamation.

Amendment of Warehousemen's Liens Act 1935 No. 19, s. 6 (Power to sell goods)

3. The Warehousemen's Liens Act 1935 is amended by omitting section 6(7) and by inserting instead the following subsection:

- (7) Nothing in this section authorises:
- (a) the sale of goods deposited prior to the commencement of the Warehousemen's Liens (Amendment) Act 1989, unless at least some part of the charges in arrears relates to a period more than 12 months before the date on which the notice of intention to sell the goods is given; or
- (b) the sale of goods deposited after the commencement of that Act, unless at least some part of the charges in arrears relates to a period more than 6 months before the date on which the notice of intention to sell the goods is given.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

The object of this Bill is to amend the Warehousemen's Liens Act 1935 to reduce the period for which charges must be owed before the power of sale provided by that Act can be exercised.

Clause 1 specifies the short title of the proposed Act.

Clause 2 provides for the commencement of the proposed Act on a proclaimed day.

Clause 3 substitutes section 6(7) of the Principal Act. The new subsection reduces from 12 months to 6 months the period for which charges must be owed before goods can be sold under the power of sale provided by that Act.

The amendment made by the proposed Act does not apply to cases in which the goods the subject of the charge were deposited for storage before the commencement of the proposed Act.
