EXPLANATORY NOTE

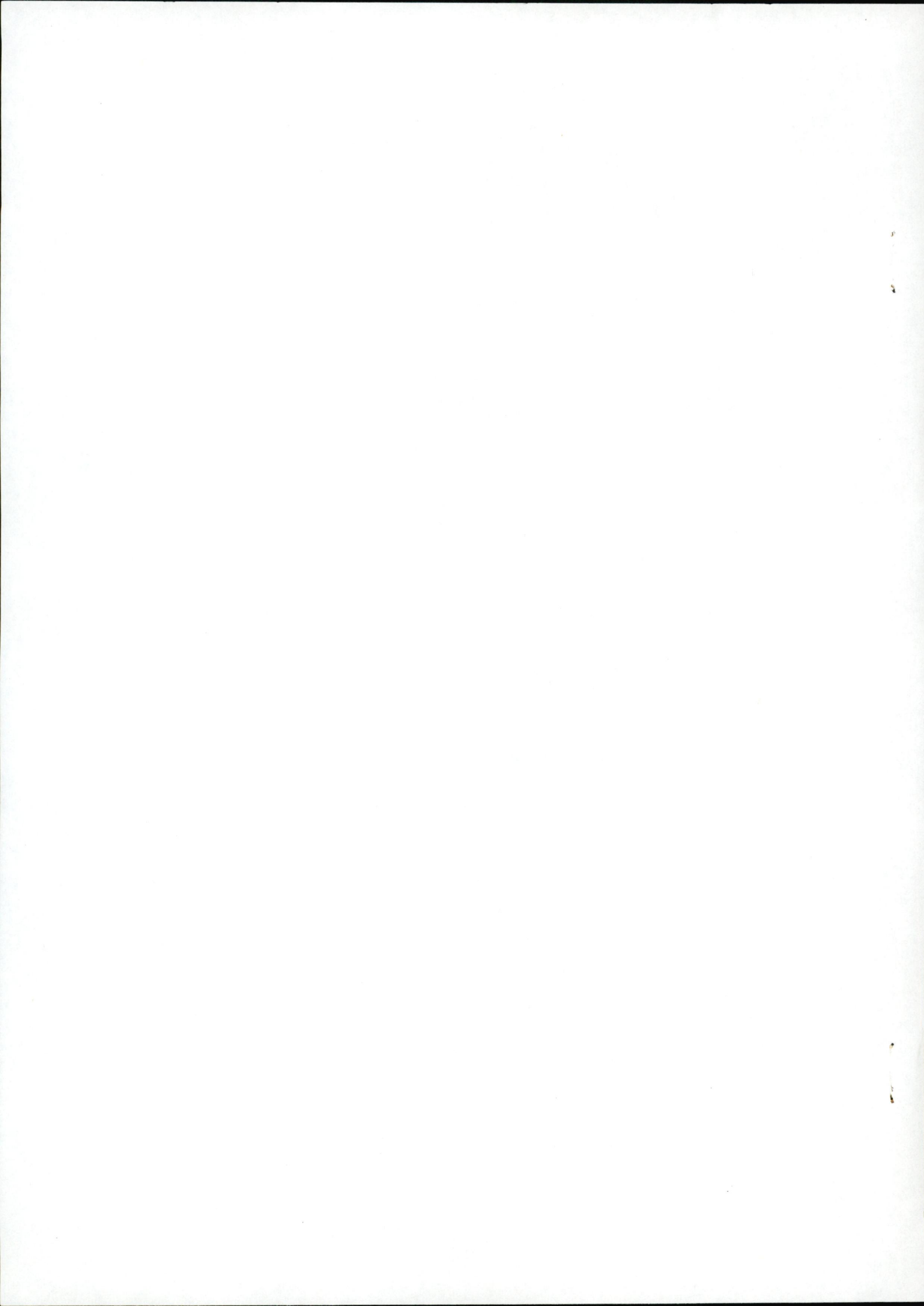
(This Explanatory Note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament)

When land was reserved as Nattai National Park and part of that land was declared as the Nattai Wilderness, the land subject to the reservation and declaration was limited to a depth of 60 metres. The object of this Bill is to remove that limitation.

Clause 1 specifies the short title of the proposed Act.

Clause 2 states that the proposed Act binds the Crown.

Clause 3 removes the limitation referred to above.

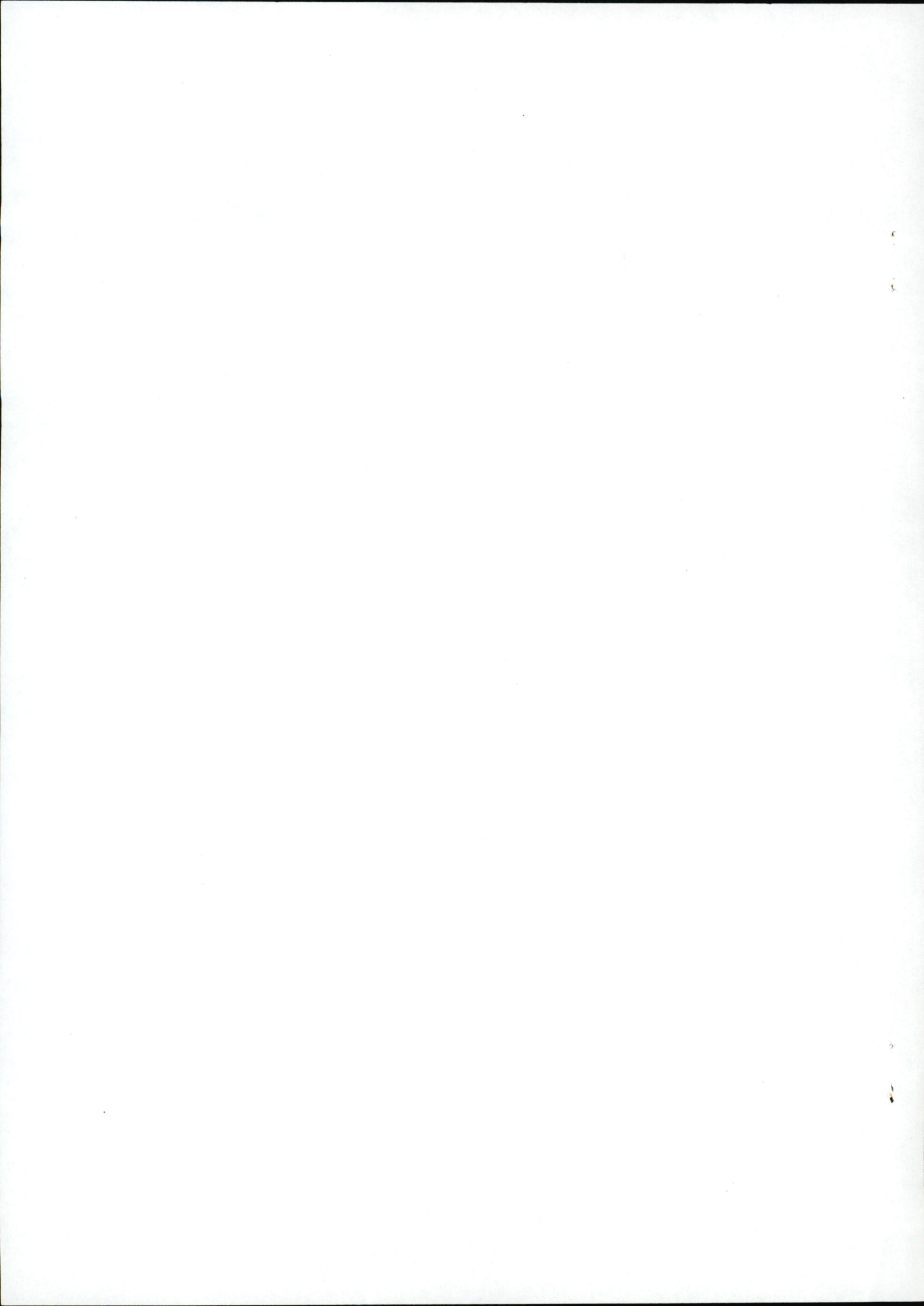

A BILL FOR

An Act to extend the Nattai National Park and Nattai Wilderness by removing the limitation on the depth of the land to which they relate.

Nattai National Park and Wilderness (Extension) 1992

The Legislature of New South Wales enacts:

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the Nattai National Park and Wilderness (Extension) Act 1992.

Act binds the Crown

2. This Act binds the Crown in right of New South Wales and, in so far as the legislative power of Parliament permits, the Crown in all its other capacities.

Extension of Nattai National Park and Wilderness

3. (1) The reservation under the National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974 of Nattai National Park proclaimed in the Gazette of 13 December 1991 at pages 10531–10533 is taken not to be and never to have been limited as to the depth of the land concerned.

(2) The declaration under that Act and the Wilderness Act 1987 of the Nattai Wilderness notified in the Gazette of 13 December 1991 at pages 10533–10534 is taken not to be and never to have been limited as to the depth of the land concerned.

(3) This section has effect despite the provisions of any other Act or law.
