

## Banks and Bank Holidays Amendment Bill 1995

## **Explanatory note**

This explanatory note relates to this Bill as introduced into Parliament.

## Overview of Bill


The object of this Bill is to amend the Banks and Bank Holidays Act 1912 so as to appoint 15 August 1995 as a public holiday to be observed throughout New South Wales to commemorate and celebrate the fiftieth anniversary of the end of the Second World War.

## Outline of provisions

Clause 1 sets out the name (also called the short title) of the proposed Act.

Clause 2 provides that the proposed Act will commence on the date of its assent.

Clause 3 amends the Banks and Bank Holidays Act 1912 so as to achieve the object referred to above.



## A Bill for

An Act to amend the *Banks and Bank Holidays Act 1912* to appoint 15 August 1995 as a public holiday to be observed throughout New South Wales to commemorate and celebrate the fiftieth anniversary of the end of the Second World War.

## The Legislature of New South Wales enacts:

#### 1 Name of Act

This Act is the Banks and Bank Holidays Amendment Act 1995.

#### 2 Commencement

This Act commences on the date of assent to this Act.

The Banks and Bank Holidays Act 1912 is amended by inserting in Part 1 of the Fourth Schedule, in appropriate order, the following words:
