An Act to provide for the deposit in the Colonial Treasury of Moneys in charge of Officers of the Supreme Court. [Assented to, 3rd February, 1857.]

WHEREAS it is expedient that the various trust moneys from Preamble. time to time in charge of the Public Officers hereinafter mentioned should be deposited in the Colonial Treasury: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales, in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. After the passing of this Act, the Master in Equity, the Curator Certain Officers of of Intestate Estates, the Prothonotary of the Supreme Court, the Chief Supreme Court to Commissioner of Insolvent Estates, and the several Official Assignees in in Treasury. Insolvency, shall severally deposit the trust moneys in their hands respectively from time to time in the Colonial Treasury, at such periods, and under and subject to such rules, as the Judges or any two of them shall from time to time make in that behalf; And all such moneys respectively shall be held in the Treasury, and be payable therefrom, to the order of such Officer, or other person, and subject to such regulations, as the said Judges or any two of them shall from time to time make in that behalf.

2. Every such rule and regulation shall be notified in the *Govern*-All Rules under this ment Gazette within fourteen days after the making thereof and shall be laid Act to be published, before both Houses of the Parliament of the Colony within seven days after the making thereof, if Parliament be then sitting, but if not, then within seven days after the commencement of its next sitting.

3. Accounts of all moneys received and paid by the Colonial Annual accounts to Treasurer under this Act, up to the thirty-first day of March in each year, ment. shall be laid by that officer before both Houses of the Parliament of this Colony, before the end of April in the same year, if Parliament be then sitting, but if not, then within seven days after the commencement of its next sitting.
