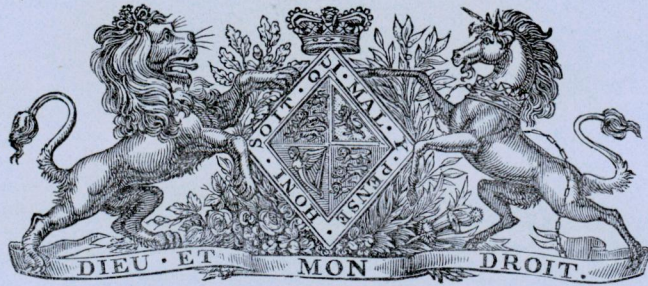

## No. XIV.

An Act to confer certain privileges on Graduates of the University of Sydney. [Assented to, 3rd February, 1857.]

**W**HEREAS it is expedient, in order to encourage the pursuit of a Preamble.  
regular and liberal education in the University of Sydney, that persons who become Graduates of that University should acquire certain privileges: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales, in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. No person who shall have taken the degree of Bachelor or Master of Arts in the University of Sydney, and who shall be desirous of being admitted to be a Barrister of the Supreme Court, shall be required to pass any examination under the provisions of the Act of Council eleventh Victoria number fifty-seven, other than an examination in Law. Exemption of Graduates in Arts from examinations for the Bar.

2. Every person who shall have taken the degree of Bachelor or Master of Arts in the University of Sydney, and who shall be desirous of being admitted as an Attorney or Solicitor of the Supreme Court, shall be exempt from any examination either before or after entering into Articles of Clerkship, other than in Law, and shall be entitled to admission as such Attorney or Solicitor, after service as a Clerk for the term of three years, instead of the term of five years, as now required. Exemption of Graduates in Arts from examinations, and shortening the period of service under Articles.
