A BILL

To extend to Graduates of other British Universities certain privileges enjoyed by Graduates of the University of Sydney.

THEREAS by the Act passed in the twentieth year of Her Majesty's Preamble. reign numbered fourteen certain privileges were conferred on Graduates of the University of Sydney desirous of being admitted as Barristers or Attorneys of the Supreme Court- and it is expedient to 5 extend the same privileges to Graduates of certain other British Universities Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :----

1. Any person who shall have taken any Degree in Arts or in Privileges conferred by 20 Vict. No. 14 Law in the University of Oxford Cambridge London Dublin or Edinburgh extended to other Universities named. 10 and who shall desire to be admitted a Barrister or an Attorney or Solicitor of the Supreme Court shall have and enjoy the same privileges as those conferred by the aforesaid Act upon Graduates of the University of 15 Sydney.

2. The like privileges shall be enjoyed by all Graduates in Arts And to certain other or in Law of any other British University in the United Kingdom or in tain cases. any Colony granting Degrees by virtue of any Statute Royal Charter or Colonial Act assented to by Her Majesty or any of Her predecessors 20 where the Degree shall have been granted after examination as in cases of the like nature at the Universities mentioned in the previous section.
